ANNUAL MEETING

TUESDAY, JANUARY 1ST, 1889.

President—Mr D. McLean. Vice-Presidents—Messrs J. C. N. Grigg, and C. M. Strachey. Judge—Mr M. Stitt. Stewards—Messrs J. Begg, G. James, H. Fowler, M. Scott, C. Smith, and E. M. Bell. Secretary—Mr D. Thomas. Treasurer—Mr M. Scott. Handicappers—The Committee. Clerk of the Course—Mr B. Hanks. Clerk of the Scales—Mr R. B. Jeff.

First Race to start at 12.30 p.m.

PROGRAMME OF EVENTS.

1. HANDICAP HURDLE RACE, of 20 sovs; nomination, 10s; acceptance, 10s. The second horse to receive 3 sovs out of the stake. Over six flights of hurdles, about 3ft. 6in. high. One mile and a half.
2. MAIDEN PLATE of 15 sovs; entrance, 15s. The second horse to receive 2 1/2 sovs out of the stake. Weight for age. One mile.
3. TINWALD CUP, of 30 sovs; nomination, 15s; acceptance, 10s. The second horse to receive 5 sovs out of the stake. One mile and a half.
4. HANDICAP TROT, of 20 sovs; nomination 10s; acceptance, 10s. The second horse to receive 3 sovs out of the stake. Weight not less than 10st. Pull and go. About three miles.
5. WELTER HANDICAP, of 12 sovs; nomination, 12s; acceptance, 10s. The second horse to receive 2 sovs out of the stake. One mile.
6. FLYING HANDICAP, of 15 sovs; nomination, 10s; acceptance, 5s. The second horse to receive 2 1/2 sovs out of the stake. Six furlongs.
7. NOVEL RACE, of 20 sovs. Winner to be sold by auction, and the whole of the proceeds to go to the funds of the Club. Post entry. Weight 8st up. Six furlongs.
8. CONSOLATION HANDICAP, of 10 sovs; entrance, 10s. Six furlongs.
9. HURRY SCURRY (if time permits), for all entrance money; entrance, 10s. For horses that have never won public money. Catch weights. Half-mile.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. The meeting will be held under the rules of racing.
2. No entry will be received except on the conditions that all claims, disputes, and objections arising out of the racing, shall be decided by the Stewards, or whom they may appoint. Their decision on all points connected with the carrying out of this programme, to be final.
3. The races are open to any horse, commonly resident in the district from the 1st October, 1888, to the date of meeting, and owned by a person who has resided in the district for the same period.
4. The district above mentioned is bounded on the north by the Selwyn River, and on the south by the Ophi River.
5. Five per cent will be deducted from the gross of all moneys payable in accordance with this programme, for the expenses of the course.
6. All nominations and acceptances to be sent to the Clerk of the Club.
7. Trotting Race—Horses must trot to the satisfaction of a Referee.

NOMINATIONS

Nominations for Tinwald Cup, Trot, Flying Handicap and Welter Handicap, accompanied by fee, name, age, description and performance of horse, and colors of rider, must be in the hands of the Secretary at Scott's Hotel, Tinwald, not later than SATURDAY, December 15th, 1888.

WEIGHTS

Weights will be posted about 7.30 p.m. on the 27th December, and will be published on the 28th. For cards with weights will be posted to all nominators or horses.

ACCEPTANCES

Acceptances for Handicaps and nominations to Maiden Plate must be in the hands of the Secretary, at Scott's Hotel, Tinwald, not later than SATURDAY, December 15th, 1888.
