**Which Machine?**

IT IS HARD TO DECIDE, ISN'T IT?

TO you who are trying to decide which Milking Machine to buy, we want to offer a few suggestions. Most likely you have looked at many different makes of machines. You have found that in most respects they are very much alike. They are all made of metal, they have a Pulsator or Pulsators, Pipes and Stall Tap through which the milk is drawn, and they have a Cup or Cups.
