SIR,—

The Legislature of this Colony having placed a sum of money at the disposal of the Government in aid of the Taranaki Relief Fund, and for the maintenance of the families of the Soldiers of the 40th Regiment that were left behind in Melbourne, I have the honor to inform you that, in pursuance of the Vote, the amount of one thousand pounds has been paid into the Union Bank in this City, and placed to the credit of the Taranaki Fund. This course has been adopted as the Bank has promised to remit the money to Auckland without charge.
