MINISTER FOR COLONIAL DEFENCE TO MAJOR-GENERAL GALLOWAY.

Colonial Defence Office,
Auckland, 4th March, 1864.

SIR,—

I have the honor to inform you, that the Military Settlers recently arrived from Australia, and at present embodied as the 4th Waikato Regiment, under Major Moule, have been brought here by the Government, as Substitutes for such members of the Auckland Militia as desire to avail themselves of the regulations recently made by the Government in that behalf. I have therefore to request that you will regard this Regiment as a part of the Auckland Militia, and in the future dispositions of the Militia and Volunteers, that you will be good enough to arrange that these men may at all times take such duties as would devolve upon that section of the local forces under your command.
