2	March 4	Hon. Defence Minister	Officer Commanding, Waikato	As Armed Constabulary employed on road work will receive 1s. a day extra, remissness to be reported.
3	March 6	Hon. Defence Minister	Officer Commanding, Waikato	To put himself in communication with Road Boards, to obtain their co-operation, and to avail himself of assistance offered by settlers.
4	May 22	Officer Commanding, Waikato	Hon. Defence Minister	Reporting employment of Constabulary in road work. The severity of the weather has caused much sickness amongst those employed in the Moana Tua Tua Swamp.
5	May 17	Hon. Defence Minister	Inspector Roberts ...	Requiring report on progress of roads, with names of officers who have displayed most zeal and earnestness in promoting road work.
6	May 25	Inspector Roberts ...	Hon. Defence Minister	Reporting fully. Can make no distinction between officers, all having shown themselves willing and anxious to further public works according as they have been directed.
7	May 30	Hon. Defence Minister	Inspector Scannell ...	Requiring report from time to time as to who the officers are that display most zeal and assiduity in promoting public works. Cases of disinclination to be reported.
8	May 31	Inspector Scannell ...	Hon. Defence Minister	Difficult to particularize where all are attentive. Sub-Inspector Gudgeon very zealous. Non-commissioned officers or men not likely to show disinclination as the work is very popular.
9	May 31	Hon. Defence Minister	Officer Commanding, Armed Constabulary, Wellington	Forwarding circular relative to the advantages of employing the Armed Constabulary on road work, and confidential memorandum thereon.
