RESOLUTION OF PROVINCIAL COUNCIL.

Provincial Council Chambers, Canterbury, 14th June, 1873.

RESOLUTION passed—"That the Council desires to express its opinion that in any legislation affecting the University of New Zealand, it would be inexpedient that any alteration should be made in the present state of the law whereby the benefits arising from that institution should be monopolized by any particular Province or Provinces. That this Resolution be forwarded to the Colonial Secretary, and to the Speakers of both Houses of the General Assembly."
