good reason, to the satisfaction of the House, not only for what has been done, but also for what has been left undone. If I understood the feeling of the House upon this point, it was this: that the works were to be steadily pushed forward as rapidly as might be, but always bearing in mind that our expenditure must be largely reduced and brought within more manageable limits.

I will now state the position of the Public Works Account, as a whole, on the 30th June last.

From this it appears that the unexpended balance is £980,189 13s. 1d., but of this sum £645,957 will be required for works already under contract £645,957 required for or authorized. My colleague, the Minister for Public Works, will submit estimates in detail of the works which it is proposed to continue and to enter upon; and it will be for the House to consider how far it is desirable to sanction them.

We propose to ask for appropriations to the extent of about £1,920,633. If the Appropriations to be Committee should see fit to grant this amount, additional Ways and Means will be £1,920,633. required for the year of £940,443 6s. 11d.

The Imperial Guaranteed Debentures have been used during the year as Guaranteed Debentures. security for advances made from time to time by the Bank of England. I propose to continue to use them in this way, as we are thereby enabled to keep a working balance always in hand, regulating it according to our requirements, and thereby saving interest; and I shall presently submit to the Committee proposals which will enable us to adopt that course.
