1. Board's Report.

Sir,— Wanganui, 15th April, 1885.

In forwarding the annual statement of accounts of the Wanganui High School, I have the honour to state that the whole of the Board's funds are safely invested in mortgages of freehold lands in this district, with the exception of a balance of accumulated interest, which is awaiting investment at a remunerative rate.

This Board has not yet any school in operation, but it is of opinion that if Government would make a grant for a building it could establish a high school in the Town of Wanganui; and, as other centres have been granted funds for such a purpose, it now desires to urge the matter upon your notice, and it trusts that Government will lose no time in placing a suitable sum upon the estimates.
