

*Resolved*, That on all goods, wares, and merchandise not enumerated above, or in the table of duties of Customs annexed to "The Customs Duties Consolidation Act, 1882," and not included in the list of articles exempted from duty by subsequent resolution, there shall be charged a duty of *ten per cent. ad valorem*.

*Resolved*, That, in the event of any of the duties hereby imposed not being confirmed, or of reductions being made in the rates specified above, the amounts levied, collected, and paid in excess of the duties, as may be imposed by the Customs Act based on these resolutions, shall be refunded to the persons who paid the same.

*Resolved*, That the under-mentioned articles shall be exempt from duty on the importation thereof into the colony :—
