IV. Sequel. Drawing. Composition. Dictation. The girls' school is a new one, having been established at the beginning of this year. It consists of twenty-four girls, whose average age is higher than will most likely be the case in subsequent years. As these girls have all entered within the year, no great difficulty has been found in teach-ing them together; but as the school grows older and classification becomes necessary I think additional teaching power and class-room accommodation will have to be found if satisfactory work is to be done. There is a very pleasant tone in the school, and a considerable display of zeal and intelligence. The progress made in French, if it is not partly due to previous acquirement, is very noteworthy, and some elementary science is being taught in a useful form.

Grammar-nouns, adjectives, verbs, first conjugation, and agir of second. Fables, 1 to 20 (some read Reader, Ahn's, 1 to 15). Lower Division : Exercises 1 to 50. Grammar-nouns, verbs, avoir and être. Geography.--New Zealand, England and Scotland (partly); general geography of Australia, North and South America, Africa, and Asia (chief physical features and political divisions). *History.*—B.C. 50 to A.D. 1377. *Grammar.*—Morell, pages 1 to 30 and 66 to 99 (parsing and analysis). *Science.*— Physiology—general description and position of the organs of the body, the blood, circulation, respiration. Elementary physics—principally Balfour Stewart, pages 1 to 61. *Reading.*—Merchant of Venice. Composition. Drawing.
