Note A.—Pensions to Natives are not pensions in the ordinary sense granted under the Civil Service Acts, and are therefore not computed upon age, length of service, or by any other fixed rule applicable to other pensions. They are, moreover, liable to withdrawal or reduction similar to the salaries of Assessors paid out of the same vote—i.e., the vote for Civil List, Native Purposes, \$27,000.

Note B.—Loyalty during the war, services to the Government as an Assessor, good influence exercised amongst their people and, in some cases, indigent circumstances, are the reasons for which the foregoing pensions have been granted.
