Ordered, "That a return be laid before this House showing the total area and situation of land which was set apart as an endowment for the Akaroa-Little River Railway; how much of such land has been sold or leased on the perpetual-lease system, giving the date of sale, the area of land and price obtained for each lot, the names of every purchaser or lessee, on whose application, the purpose assigned for such sale, and the authority consenting thereto; the total amount realised from such sales and leases of the land, and how expended."—(Mr. Jovce.)

Return showing Particulars as to Area and Amount realised by Sale of 50,000 Acres of Land, set aside as an Endowment for the Akaroa and Little River Railway.

Land reserved under "The Ellesmere and Forsyth Reclamation and Akaroa Railway Trust Act, 1876," 50,000 acres. One-half of the proceeds of the sale of such land to be paid into the Ellesmere and Forsyth Reclamation and Akaroa Railway Trust Account. Area sold under the above Act, 21,723 acres 3 roods 14 perches, at £2 per acre. Amount paid to Trust Account, £21,723 16s. 9d.

Land sold under the provisions of "The Railways Construction Act, 1878," the whole of the proceeds of which are carried to the credit of the Trust, 23,434 acres 2 roods 1 perch, at £2 per acre: £46,869 0s. 3d.
