 need to be received and considered forthwith.
 436. Resolutions of the Committees of
 Supply and Ways and Means reported to
 the House are read a first and second
 time and agreed to; or may be amended,
 postponed, recommitted, or disagreed to.
 437. No Amendment whereby the charge
 upon the people will be increased may be
 made to any such Resolution, unless such
 charge so increased shall not exceed the
 charge already existing by virtue of any Act
 of Parliament.

XXXIII—Miscellaneous

492. In all cases not hereinbefore provided
 for, Mr. Speaker shall decide, taking for his
 guide the rules, forms and usages of the
 House of Commons, so far as the same
 can be applied to the proceedings of this
 House.

493. It is contrary to the law and usage
 of Parliament that any Member of this House
 should be permitted to engage, either by
 himself or any partner, in the manage-
 ment of Private Bills before the House,
 other House of Parliament, for pecuniary
 reward.

494. It is contrary to the usage and cus-
 tomary to the dignity of this House, that
 any of the Members should bring forward,
 promote, or advocate in this House any
 proceeding or measure in which he may
 have acted or been concerned for or in
 consideration of any pecuniary reward.

495. Strangers may at any time enter
 during debate, be ordered to withdraw from
 the body of the House and the galleries,
 the galleries on a ribbon, without notice,
 to that effect being put and carried; and no
 Amendment or Debate shall be allowed in
 the Question; and in his own discretion the
 Speaker may at any time order strangers to
 withdraw.
