PARTICULARS OF VARIOUS AMOUNTS OF TAXATION COLLECTED.

*Return to an Order of the House of Representatives dated 28th October, 1898.*

*Ordered, "That there be laid before this House a return showing the following particulars for each of the years 1893 to 1898: (a) The amount of income-tax paid by companies, and the amount received from other sources; (b) the amount received as absentee-tax; (c) as ordinary land-tax; and (d) as graduated tax."—(Mr. O'REGAN.)*
