The total expenditure to date since 1904 is £255,170, including £182,365 spent on the acquisition of land.

Proposals are in hand for the reservation of numerous areas of Crown land in various districts, while, should funds permit, the acquisition of a few selected areas of privately-owned land will be attempted.

Existing reserves are generally in good condition, and there were no serious outbreaks of fire during the year.

It is becoming increasingly difficult for the Department to maintain constant supervision of all reserves, but inspections are made by the field staff as often as possible. Scenic Boards and honorary Inspectors continue to give valuable service.
