THURSDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF MARCH, 1943

*Ordered*, "That a Select Committee be appointed, consisting, by leave, of eleven members, to consider all Bills containing provisions of a technical legal character which may be referred to it, with power to confer and sit together with any similar Committee appointed by the Legislative Council: the Committee to consist of the Hon. Mr. Speaker, Mr. Bodkin, Mr. Broadfoot, Mr. Combs, Mr. Denham, Mr. Endean, Mr. Harker, Mr. Munro, Mr. Richards, Mr. Schramm, and the Mover."—(Hon. Mr. MASON.)

WEDNESDAY, THE 10TH DAY OF MARCH, 1943

*Ordered*, "That the Patents, Designs, and Trade-marks Amendment Bill be referred to the Statutes Revision Committee."—(Hon. Mr. MASON.)
