## ORDERS OF REFERENCE

*Extracts from the Journals of the House of Representatives*

WEDNESDAY, THE 18TH DAY OF JULY, 1945

*Ordered*, "That a Select Committee be appointed, consisting of ten members, to consider all Bills containing provisions of a technical legal character which may be referred to it, with power to confer and sit together with any similar Committee appointed by the Legislative Council: the Committee to consist of the Hon. Mr. Speaker, Mr. Algie, Mr. Bodkin, Mr. Coleman, Mr. Combs, Mr. Denham, Mr. Harker, Mr. Richards, Mr. T. C. Webb, and the Mover."—(Hon. Mr. MASON.)

*Ordered*, "That all petitions not finally dealt with during the session of 1944 be again referred to the same Committees as they were referred to during the said session."—(Hon. Mr. NASH.)

WEDNESDAY, THE 1ST DAY OF AUGUST, 1945

*Ordered*, "That the Criminal Appeal Bill be referred to the Statutes Revision Committee."—(Hon. Mr. MASON.)

THURSDAY, THE 4TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1945

*Ordered*, "That the Evidence Amendment Bill be referred to the Statutes Revision Committee."—(Hon. Mr. MASON.)

FRIDAY, THE 30TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1945

*Ordered*, "That the Statutes Amendment Bill be referred to the Statutes Revision Committee."—(Hon. Mr. MASON.)

MONDAY, THE 3RD DAY OF DECEMBER, 1945

*Ordered*, "That the Statutes Revision Committee have leave to sit during the present sitting of the House."—(Mr. RICHARDS, for the Hon. Mr. SCHRAMM.)
