REPORT

PART I.—FRIENDLY SOCIETIES

REGISTRATIONS

One society was registered during the year-W.M.C.: Onehunga Working-men's Club.

The above figures show a decrease in membership equal to 2.41 per cent., as compared with 3.10 per cent. for 1946.

* The word "lodge" when applied to all societies is to be understood as embracing the synonymous terms "court," "tent," &c., as used in the various orders.

The total funds of the societies and branches as at 31st December, 1947, amounted to $\pounds 6,419,523$, made up as follows: Sick and Funeral Funds (inclusive of amounts transferred to special funds out of surplus), $\pounds 5,895,785$; Medical and Management Funds, goods, &c., $\pounds 523,738$. Dividing the total funds by the number of members at the end of the year it is found the average capital per member is now $\pounds 81$ 15s. 5d.

Sickness

The number of members sick during 1947 was 15,883, equal to 21 per 100 members at risk. The sickness experienced during 1947 was 324,038 weeks, equal to 20 weeks 2 days per sick member and 4 weeks 2 days for each member at risk.

Mortality

The number of members who died during 1947 was 1,158, equal to 14.57 per 1,000 members at risk. The number of wives of members who died was 371.

Sick and Funeral Funds

The contributions and entrance fees paid to Sick and Funeral Funds in 1947 amounted to $\pounds151,069$. Divided by the mean number of members, the average for 1947 was $\pounds1$ 18s., as against $\pounds1$ 18s. 2d. for 1946.

The interest and rent received by the lodges and central bodies amounted to $\pounds 221,966$ in 1947, equal to $\pounds 2$ 15s. 10d. per member, as against $\pounds 2$ 13s. 2d. for 1946.

The amount of sickness benefit paid was $\pounds 176,642$ in 1947, equal to $\pounds 11$ 2s. 5d. per member sick and $\pounds 2$ 4s. 5d. per member, as against $\pounds 10$ 9s. 3d. and $\pounds 2$ 5s. 3d. respectively for 1946. Viewing the amount paid in relation to the weeks of sickness, the average benefit per week is found to be 10s. 11d. in 1947, as against 11s. 4d. for 1946.

The funeral benefit paid amounted to $\pounds 63,478$ in 1947, equal to 16s. per member, as compared with 14s. 8d. for 1946.

The total worth of the Sick and Funeral Funds at the beginning of 1947 was £5,122,801, and at the end of the year £5,242,722.

Investment of Funds

The net income from investments credited to the Sick and Funeral Funds for 1947 amounted to $\pm 221,966$, the average rate being ± 4 7s. 6d. per cent., as against ± 4 8s. 2d. in 1946.
