## EXTRACTS FROM THE REPORTS OF THE COMMISSIONERS OF CROWN LANDS ON SETTLEMENT OPERATIONS DURING THE TWELVE MONTHS WHICH ENDED ON THE 31st MARCH, 1901.

## AUCKLAND.

A GLANCE at the annual summary of transactions below shows that the past year, both from a land settlement and a revenue point of view, is one of the most successful that has as yet been reported upon. Selectors under various tenures have competed for and absorbed 239,843 acres of Crown land, whilst the revenue totals to  $\pounds 59,221$ , and with endowment revenue added reaches a grand total of  $\pounds 61,416$ , a most satisfactory result from every point of view. The large areas opened for selection within the County of Kawhia were all eagerly competed for by a capital class of settlers, who have felled large areas of forest ready for burning and grassing, but owing to the very moist summer have not yet been able to obtain satisfactory burns.
