REPORT.

THE year will be a memorable one in the department on account of the introduction by New The year will be a memorable one in the department on account of the introduction by New Zealand of the universal penny-post—the first universal penny-post to be introduced by any country in the world. The continuance of the expansion of the telegraph business, which has increased in volume of paid telegrams in four years by no less than 54 68 per cent., is remarkable. In that period the value of paid telegrams has risen by 29 68 per cent.—a sure indication of the success of the sixpenny telegram. The balance of expenditure over revenue on the telegraph side, which two years ago was nearly £30,000, has fallen to £8,036 for 1900—a most gratifying result. The postal work continues to show a steady and satisfactory increase.
