Return to an Order of the House of Representatives dated 31st July, 1901.

Ordered, "That there be laid before this House a comparative return between the North Island and the South Island, showing respectively for each Island up to the end of the last financial year,—(1) The total expenditure for roads and bridges; (2) the total cost of railway construction; (3) the acreage of land acquired under the Land for Settlements Acts, and the total cost to the Crown in settling people upon these lands; and (4) the total amount paid by the New Zealand Government for all other lands acquired by the Crown, and the total amount received by that Government for all of these lands disposed of by them."—(Mr. Palmer.)
