## “PREFERENTIAL AND RECIPROCAL TRADE ACT, 1903”

(ADDITIONAL DUTIES PAID UNDER) TO 30TH JUNE, 1904.

*Return to an Order of the House of Representatives dated the 30th June, 1904.*

*Ordered, “That there be laid before this House a return showing the additional amount of Customs duty paid up to the 30th June on each article of foreign goods specified in the First, Second, and Third Schedules of ‘The Preferential and Reciprocal Trade Act, 1903.’”—(Mr. BUCHANAN.)*
