Although the local traffic during the year 1905-6 has not been up to expectations, the increase in the oversea traffic during the year 1905-6 has been much greater than for previous years. This in the oversea traffic during the year 1905-6 has been much greater than for previous years. This is the more gratifying, as the local traffic has, owing to the late season and unsettled weather during the summer, not been up to previous years. The increased receipts at the Hermitage and Milford Track, which exist principally on oversea traffic, as compared with Hanmer, a resort depending almost wholly on local support, afford a striking instance of the effect of weather-conditions on local travel. To this is due the slight shrinkage in the gross receipts for the year. The receipts for the year totalled £15,820, as against £16,018 3s. 1d., showing a decrease of 107.122, 2d
