Inspector Cameron visited 41 places—namely, Waikaia, Riversdale, Gore, Riverton, Wyndham, Bluff, Pukerau, Nightcaps, Woodlands, Winton, Orepuki, Otautau, Kapuka, Mandeville, Lumsden, Waimatuku, Round Hill, Waianiwa, Makarewa, Wallacetown, Colac, Aparima, Mataura, Gummie's Bush, Tisbury, Waikiwi, Kennington, Fortrose, Waimahaka, Menzies' Ferry, Edendale, Woodend, Wallacetown Township, Thornbury, Drummond, Wakapatu, West Plains, Clifton, Richmond Grove, and Myross Bush; making 145 visits. It will thus be seen that the district has received efficient supervision during the past twelve months.
