SUPERANNUATION:

CIVIL SERVANTS RECEIVING A SALARY OF £300 AND UPWARDS, AND OVER SIXTY-FIVE YEARS OF AGE, STILL RETAINED IN THE SERVICE.

Return to an Order of the House of Representatives dated the 22nd August, 1913.

Ordered, "That there be laid before this House a return giving the names and ages of all officers receiving a salary of £300 a year and over who have reached the retiring-age of sixty-five years and who are still being retained in the Public Service; such return to give reasons (if any) for their retention in the Service."—(Mr. HANAN.)
