SIR,—

Whakapaupakahi No. 4.

We, the undersigned successors according to Maori custom of Heneriata Haeata (deceased), and I, Wiremu te Haeata, or William Wright, the devisee under the said Heneriata Haeata's will to the above-mentioned Whakapaupakahi No. 4 Block, do hereby abandon all benefit derivable under section 28 of the Native Land Adjustments Act, 1910, in consequence of a petition by the said Heneriata Haeata (deceased), and request that the title to the said block be issued at as an early date as possible.

[TRANSLATION.]

Ko matou kinga tangata kua haina io matou ingoa i raro iho nei nga kai riiwhi mo Heneriata Haeata tupapaku, i te tikanga o te ture Maori meau me Wiremu te Haeata ara Wiremu Raiti te mea i tukua kia ia ana hea i Whakapaupakahi No. 4 Poraka, i roto i te Wira taua Heneriata Haeata Ewhatea kore katoa ana matou i nga painga e puta mai kia matou i raro i Tekiona 28 o Ture Whakaitatika Whenua Maori, 1910, i te pitihana a taua Heneriata Haeata tupapaku, ko to matou hiahia kia tere te whakaoti i te taitara o taua Poraka i naianei.
