Mr. Buddo, the Hon. Mr. Coates, Mr. Forbes, Mr. Jennings, Mr. McCallum, the Right Hon. Mr. Massey, Mr. E. Newman, the Hon. Mr. R. H. Rhodes, Mr. T. W. Rhodes, Mr. Scott, Mr. R. W. Smith, Mr. Statham, Mr. Witty, and the mover."—(Hon. Mr. Guthere.)
