1 AM directed to report that, in view of the fact that the companies are responsible for the failure to carry out the provisions of section 7, subsection (2), of the Mining Amendment Act, 1919, the Committee is of opinion that the mine-owners should pay the miners' wages for the time they have been idle in cases where the men ceased work for the purpose of securing compliance with the requirements of the Act.

The Goldfields and Mines Committee, to which was referred the Coal-mines Amendment Bill (No. 2), has the honour to report that, having carefully considered the same, it recommends that it be allowed to proceed, with the amendments shown on the copy attached hereto. 25th October, 1920.

No. 311.—Petition of William Gay and 21 Others, of Cambrian (and 4 similar Petitions, as per Schedule attached).

Praying for compensation for losses sustained through the restriction on sale of gold in the open

market during the war period.

I am directed to report that in the opinion of the Committee the petitions should be referred to the Government for favourable consideration. The Committee desires to point out that during recent years no other industry was so hard hit as gold-mining, the commodity being, in the interests of the Empire and at the request of the Imperial Government, prohibited from export, with the result that a loss, based upon the world market price, of fully 20s. per ounce was sustained by gold-miners. Furthermore, the Committee desires to point out that scheelite-miners were permitted by the Imperial authorities to export scheelite during the same period.
