CASUALTIES.

The following are the casualties for the year ended 31st March last: Retired on pension under the Public Service Superannuation Act, 7; died, 4; resigned voluntarily, 42; called upon to resign, 2; dismissed, 3: total, 58. This is 2 less than in the preceding year.

CRIMINAL STATISTICS.
