GRADES—AA: Extra super wool, well grown, of good colour and condition, entirely skirtd. A: Super wool, well grown, in good condition, and skirtd. B: Medium wool, well grown; may be of indifferent colour and condition, and/or unskirtd. C: Inferior wool, indifferent growth and character, dirty, heavy in condition, slightly seedy, and/or unskirtd. D: Very inferior, and/or excessively seedy.
