Of the total number released after undergoing reformative detention 20 per cent. have been returned to prison either for non-compliance with conditions of release or for committing further offences; 5 per cent. have died, absconded, &c.; leaving 75 per cent. who have not further offended.

Of the number recommitted to reformatories, 63 individuals were returned twice, 20 three times, 8 four times, 4 five times, and 1 seven times.
