The Native Land Court of New Zealand, Aotea District.—In the matter of the petition, No. 241 of 1921 (Session II), of Taitoko-ki-Ngamotu Bailey, praying for an inquiry as to succession to interests of Ngawhairepo Hakaraia (deceased) in Sections 7 and 13, Ngatirahiri Block, referred to the Court under section 35 of the above-mentioned Act.
