

3. Every person commits an offense who sells or offers to sell as hand-made or hand-tailored any garment that is not wholly made by hand and otherwise made in accordance with the requirements of these regulations respecting tailor-made garments.

4. Every person commits an offense who sells or offers to sell as tailor-made any garment that is not tailor-made.

5. A garment sold, offered for sale, or described as tailor, tailored to order, or tailored to measure, or in any other manner represented to have been tailor-made shall for the purpose of these regulations be deemed to have been sold, offered for sale, or described as tailor-made, as the case may be, if any person sells, or agrees or offers to sell, or advertises for sale both tailor-made garments and other garments made to measure, he shall before selling or agreeing to sell any garment made to measure that is not tailor-made inform the purchaser that the garment is not tailor-made; and in any proceedings for a breach of this regulation it shall lie on the seller to prove that he so informed the purchaser.

6. If any person sells, or agrees or offers to sell, or advertises for sale both tailor-made garments and other garments made to measure, he shall before selling or agreeing to sell any garment made to measure that is not tailor-made inform the purchaser that the garment is not tailor-made; and in any proceedings for a breach of this regulation it shall lie on the seller to prove that he so informed the purchaser.

7. For the purpose of these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

(a) "Tailor-made" means made to measure by hand to the extent and in accordance with the conditions prescribed in the Schedule hereto, and so far as the work is performed by employees carried out in accordance with the provisions of the current awards or industrial agreements relating to the employment of shop tailors and shop tailoresses in the industry. For the purpose of regulation 6 hereof the expression "tailor-made" shall be deemed to include "hand-made".

(b) "Garment" means a kind of boy's coat, trousers, breeches, vest, or overcoat (other than an elasticated).

SCHEDULE

The minimum amount of work to be performed by hand in a tailor-made garment and the special conditions for the making thereof are set out hereunder—

COATS AND OVERCOATS

Minimum Handwork

- All button seams in body-fitting coats.
- All button seams in body-fitting coats (including 2 1/2).
- All facings put on before shoulders are sewn (all button seams).
- All collar stays.
- All pockets faced.
- All canvas and inlets padded.
- Sleeve-faltings telled top and bottom.
- Shoulders and sleeves sewn on.
- Collar padded and sewn on.
- Prick, shoulders and bottoms of linings telled.
- Buttons and buttons.
- All silk linings.

Special Conditions

All coats made by a tailor shall be pressed by hand. A coat made by a tailoress may be pressed by a tailor or presser.

VESTS

Minimum Handwork

- All button seams in body-fitting coats.
- Buttons and buttons.

TRUSERS AND BREECHES

Minimum Handwork

- All button seams in body-fitting coats.
- Prick of button catch telled.
- 1 1/2 inch tuck.
- Front and back seam and top seam telled to line.
- Hand tuck and waistband.
- Bottom, bottom and waistband.

Special Conditions

Trousers and breeches shall be shrunk and pressed off by a presser or tailor.
