(8.) Surveys of a large number of villages and the making of survey plans for their remodelling. A number of villages are now in process of being remodelled.
(9.) Greater activity and better work on the part of the District Councils, a number of which have got their people to agree to local taxtoin for village improvements, such as sanitation, water-supplies, and electric light. Funds raised in this manner are densited in the book and electric light. deposited in the bank and audited by this Department.
