REPORT OF THE CONTROLLER AND AUDITOR-GENERAL.

I HAVE the honour to submit my report for the year ended 31st March, 1937, in terms of subsections (2), (3), and (4) of section 89 of the Public Revenues Act, 1926.

In connection with these reports, which the Controller and Auditor-General is required to submit to Parliament year by year, it is perhaps advisable that I should explain that it is necessary to comment only on a very small percentage of the matters affecting the Public Accounts which come under the notice of Audit during each year. It will be readily understood that in the vast majority of cases where questions regarding ordinary transactions are raised by Audit a settlement is arrived at after discussion with the Treasury or the Department concerned, and there is no occasion therefore for reference to be made to these cases in the reports to Parliament.

The full Statement of the Receipts and Payments of the Public Account is contained in two parliamentary papers—namely, (1) B.-1 [Pt. I], which shows, under main headings, the receipts and payments of the funds and accounts comprising the Public Account, and also shows details of the expenditure under the annual appropriations, Civil List, and the Unauthorized Expenditure Account, and (2) B.-1 [Pt. II], which shows certain of the receipts and payments in greater detail than they are shown in B.-1 [Pt. I], and as the last-mentioned paper for 1936-37 has already been laid before Parliament, it only remains necessary for me now to present Part II in accordance with the usual practice.

Treatment of Exchange in the Public Accounts.

Attention has been drawn from time to time to the method of treating exchange in the Public Accounts, and I have to state that the position is still unsatisfactory. A slight improvement was made during the year, exchange costs having been recovered from Post Office and Railways on overseas expenditure made from Public Works Fund votes for these two Departments. This improvement has little effect on the general position, as the greater portion of the exchange cost results from the payment of interest in London and is paid from the Consolidated Fund. No charge is made against the separate accounts for exchange on interest payments, the whole amount being borne by the Ordinary Revenue Account. It can readily be seen that this procedure has the effect of understating the expenditure of the accounts affected, and the published figures do not disclose the true position of the various undertakings. No adjustment for exchange is made in any of the departmental accounts within the Consolidated Fund, and although this does not affect the position of the Fund as a whole, the departmental accounts and balance-sheets of those Departments whose expenditure is made through the Consolidated Fund are misleading and inaccurate.

Method of showing Transfers between Accounts within the Public Account.

Since 1928 the Controller and Auditor-General has each year in his annual report to Parliament drawn attention to the method adopted by the Treasury of showing in the published accounts investments and transfers between accounts within the Public Account. The Audit Office raises no objection to these transfers, which are provided for in the Public Revenues Act, 1926, but considers that the result of showing the transactions in this manner is misleading. No payment is shown in the lending sub-account although the receipt is shown in the borrowing sub-account, with the result that the amount of the transfer remains in the balance of the lending sub-account as an investment, and appears again in the balance of the borrowing sub-account as cash, thus causing the total of the balances of the sub-accounts which make up the balance of Public Account to be inflated by the amount of the transfers.

The Treasury has authority under section 16, Finance Act, 1927 (No. 2), to treat these transactions in this manner, and contends that the balances of the Public Accounts are shown properly in the published figures. As this matter has been brought to the notice of Parliament on numerous occasions, and has been discussed by the Public Accounts Committee at various times, I do not in the meantime propose to pursue the subject any further.

Repayment of the Public Debt.

The following table gives particulars of the amount of securities redeemed during the year under the provisions of the Repayment of the Public Debt Act, 1925, and also of the total amount so redeemed to 31st March, 1937:—

Method of showing Receipts from State Advances Corporation in the Public Accounts.

During the year the sum of £1,224,817 14s. 11d. was paid to Public Account by the State Advances Corporation under the provisions of the State Advances Corporation of New Zealand Act, 1934–35. This amount represents £1,010,947 6s. 8d. interest on stock issued to the Minister of Finance in terms of section 38 (1), £142,996 6s. 11d. balance of profit for the year ended 31st March, 1936, payable in terms of section 42 (a), and £70,874 1s. 4d. on account of interest on the General Reserve Fund payable under section 35 (2). These amounts do not show in the

Public Accounts as a credit from the State Advances Corporation, but are included therein under the following headings:—

In the opinion of the Audit Office the whole of the amount should be shown as "Receipts" in the Ordinary Revenue Account, so that the total received from the Corporation may be clearly seen.

Control of Expenditure.

In previous reports the attention of Parliament has been drawn to the tendency in recent legislation to depart from certain established methods which have been built up during a long period of years with a view to ensuring proper and efficient

control over public expenditure.

I should like to make reference to the legislation which was introduced last session to enable the Crown to acquire the farm training-station Flock House from the trustees of the New Zealand Sheepowners' Acknowledgment of Debt to British Seamen Fund. The appropriation provision in section 32 of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal Act, 1936, gave the Minister of Finance power to pay the purchase price of the land and other property acquired out of such fund or account as the Minister in his discretion might determine.

The Minister of Finance may reasonably be expected to exercise a wise discretion in such matters, but the duty of deciding which fund is to bear the expenditure

should rest with Parliament.

The Public Accounts of New Zealand contain many separate funds or accounts wherein moneys have been set aside for the purpose of promoting trading activities or developmental schemes fostered by the Government. Any of these moneys could have been legally used for the purchase-money if the Minister so desired, and the action could not have been questioned.

Internal Marketing of Primary Produce.

In December of last year the Government decided to undertake the internal marketing of butter, cheese, bacon, and other foodstuffs, so that fluctuations in price to consumers caused by speculation would be minimized, and purchased the business of Picot Bros., Ltd., Wellington. The legal and financial advisers of the Government expressed some doubt on the question of whether this undertaking was authorized by the Primary Products Marketing Act, 1936, and it was decided to charge the capital expenditure and working-expenses of the purchased business to Unauthorized Expenditure Account. This course was agreed to by the Audit Office on the undertaking by the Prime Minister that the Government would promote any validating legislation which might be necessary.

Unauthorized Expenditure Account.

Section 58 of the Public Revenues Act, 1926, authorizes the Government to expend money in excess of or without the appropriation of Parliament, and provision is made therein whereby sums not exceeding £250,000 may be *issued* for services other than the services of Government Railways Department in respect of which special provision is made.

It was anticipated as the result of the operations in connection with the internal marketing of produce to which reference is made above that the limit of £250,000 would prove insufficient to meet requirements for the year, as the statutory provision governing "Unauthorized Expenditure" does not allow any

recoveries on account of "Unauthorized Expenditure" to be reissued. The Prime Minister accordingly gave an undertaking to have any over-issue validated.

In the Abstract of the Unauthorized Expenditure Account appearing in B.–1 [Pt. I] the recoveries, including £13,381 4s. 10d. receipts from marketing, have been shown as deductions, with the result that the net expenditure, excluding Working Railways, appears as £232,795 17s. 8d. The total, however, issued from the Unauthorized Expenditure Account was £260,959 19s. 9d., and the excess of £10,959 19s. 9d. requires to be validated.

Delay in Publication of Annual Accounts.

One of the reasons that has been offered for the delay in the publication of the annual accounts is that the audited figures were not available. This statement might reasonably give rise to an impression that the delay was attributable largely to the work of examination and not to the method of public accounting in New Zealand, which, in actual fact, is the real reason for the late presentation of the figures.

This matter was the subject of comment in the Controller and Auditor-General's report of 1934, when a comparison of the British and New Zealand systems disclosed the difficulties of ascertaining the result of the year's operations in New Zealand as expeditiously as in Great Britain.

A considerable amount of the delay could be avoided, however, by the Treasury's observance of statutory requirements and more timely action on the part of Departments.

The Public Revenues Act, 1926, section 85 (1), requires the Treasury to send an Abstract of the Public Account to the Audit Office within thirty days after the end of each financial year. This year the Treasury kept its books open for a considerable period after the 31st March, with the result that the accounts were not submitted for audit until the 18th May, almost three weeks later than the time allowed by statute. The delay is largely due to the fact that Imprestees' vouchers received subsequently to 31st March were included in the accounts for the financial year, although the law provides that payments by Imprestees shall be deemed to be made on the day on which the accounts of the same are received at the Treasury. If the Treasury books were closed on the 31st March and Departments were advised by the Treasury to submit all transactions prior to this date, the accounts could be finalized and the figures made available much earlier than at present.

The abstract of the accounts was examined and returned to the Treasury for revision four days after receipt in the Audit Office, which is ample evidence that the delay is not in the examination of the accounts, but is rather due to the system which is followed. The Treasury has under consideration a scheme for amalgamating certain particulars in the abstract and publishing a simpler and more concise form that will show clearly the main features of the year's operations. Particular attention should be paid to items of public expenditure which are provided for by special or permanent appropriation, as these items could with advantage be brought within the ambit of an annual vote.

Apart from condensing the accounts, it is sound financial policy to establish more effective parliamentary control and criticism over Government expenditure by appropriating grants annually. A large proportion of the expenditure in New Zealand is appropriated without estimates being submitted to Parliament. Sir Otto Niemeyer referred to this unusual arrangement, and suggested that a number of the services could be more suitably provided. In England direct or recurring charges on the Consolidated Fund are authorized by special statutory provision, but there is a disinclination to use permanent appropriations in any cases which could satisfactorily be provided for by an annual vote.

I may add that the Audit Office is anxious to assist the Government in every possible way by expediting the publication of the public accounts and by dealing with them as promptly as possible.

Cases in which Provisions of the Law have not been carried out.

Electoral Act, 1927.

A sum of £500 sterling in respect of expenses of transit to London was paid to Mr. Jordan, now High Commissioner for New Zealand, while he was still a member of the Legislature, and as the payment contravened the provisions of the Electoral Act, 1927, the Audit Office was unable to pass the voucher.

On an assurance being given by the Acting Prime Minister that legislation validating the payment would be introduced the voucher was passed by the Audit Office.

In connection with the Coronation Celebrations three members of the House of Representatives and one member of the Legislative Council were appointed to represent New Zealand. Grants of £200 each were approved by Cabinet, and, on the undertaking of the Prime Minister that validating legislation would be provided during the coming session, the payments were passed by the Audit Office.

Native Trustee Act, 1930.

It was desired to make a payment of £500 from the Native Trustee's Account towards the cost of erection of a Maori meeting-house as a memorial to the late Sir James Carroll, but, as there was no authority to expend the moneys of the account for this purpose, the Audit Office was unable to pass the payment.

On receiving an undertaking from the Prime Minister that validating legislation would be introduced, the Audit Office agreed to pass the voucher.

Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act, 1915.

In December, 1936, the Government decided to transfer to the Housing Account administered by the State Advances Corporation certain properties bought in by the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Account and held as assets by that account.

There was no statutory authority by which the transfer of these assets to the Housing Account could be effected, but the Audit Office agreed to the transaction being proceeded with on an assurance being given by the Government that validating legislation would be introduced during the next ensuing session of Parliament.

Pensions Act, 1926, and War Pensions Act, 1915.

It is provided in the statute governing the payment of Civil pensions and in the regulations prescribed under the War Pensions Act for the payment of war pensions that pensions the due date of which is the 1st day of the month may be paid on the 23rd day of the month preceding the due date of payment. Following upon representations made by the Minister in charge of the Department that payment of pensions be arranged from and including the preceding Friday when the pension-pay day falls on a Sunday, the Audit Office agreed to pass pension warrants paid before the prescribed due date on receiving an assurance from the Minister that the necessary validating legislation would be introduced during the next ensuing session of Parliament.

The legislation in respect of Civil pensions is now provided in section 30 of the Pensions Amendment Act, 1936, but amending regulations in respect of war pensions have not, as yet, been prescribed.

National Provident Fund Act, 1926.

During the year cases occurred where employees of Hospital Boards who were contributors to superannuation schemes under the National Provident Fund took up duty in State institutions, but there is no authority of law under which these employees could continue their membership. As it was desired by the Government that they should be allowed to continue their contributions, the Audit Office agreed to pass the relative entries in the accounts of the National Provident Fund on receipt of an assurance from the Government that the necessary legislative authority would be introduced.

Reserves and other Lands Disposal Act. 1936.

Section 32 (3) of the Reserves and other Lands Disposal Act, 1936, authorized the Government to acquire the property known as "Flock House" from the trustees of the New Zealand Sheepowners' Acknowledgment of Debt to British Seamen Fund, but this legislation did not confer the authority necessary to enable the trustees to sell the chattels thereon, which the Crown desired to buy.

On receiving an undertaking from the Prime Minister that any validating legislation required would be introduced during the next ensuing session of Parliament, the Audit Office agreed to pass the payments made from the Public Account in connection therewith.

Traffic Regulations, 1936, and Motor-vehicles Fitness Fees Regulations, 1937.

These regulations were made pursuant to the Motor-vehicles Act, 1924, and prescribed the fees that were payable by owners of vehicles for every warrant of fitness that was issued by the examining officials.

Where the examination was conducted by an officer of the Crown the fees were to be credited to Public Account, but civic authorities who were rendering a similar service to the Government were permitted to retain the regulation fees.

The regulations which were framed to meet public expediency and convenience were found, however, to conflict with the provisions of section 24 of the Motorvehicles Act, 1924, which required the payment of all fees into the Main Highways Account. The Audit Office, on grounds of equity, agreed to raise no objection to the compliance of the regulations provided the Hon. the Acting Prime Minister gave an undertaking that the necessary validating legislation would be introduced next session, and this assurance was duly given.

In three other cases in which the Audit Office agreed to pass payments for which there was no authority of law, the necessary validating legislation was obtained last session.

Statement of Royalties payable to the Crown and unpaid at the 31st March, 1937.

Section 91 (2) of the Public Revenues Act, 1926, reads as follows:—

"The Controller and Auditor-General shall include in the report to be prepared by him pursuant to subsection two of section eighty-nine hereof a statement as to all royalties payable to the Crown and for the time being unpaid, setting forth in respect of such royalties—

- "(a) The name of the person by whom the same are payable;
- "(b) The amount payable by each such person; and
- "(c) The steps (if any) that have been taken to recover the said royalties, and, if no such steps have been taken, the reasons for allowing the said royalties to remain outstanding."

It has not been the practice to publish the names of debtors in respect of unpaid royalties, although the Act requires that this shall be done, and, if Parliament does not require this information, it is desirable that the law be amended. In the figures hereunder are included all amounts which were shown in the books of Departments as owing and unpaid on the 31st March last. Many of the amounts have since been paid, and returns received from the various Departments concerned show that steps are being taken to collect moneys which are still owing. No good purpose appears to be served by publishing these particulars in my report each year, and it does not seem to be reasonable to draw a distinction between amounts owing to the Crown by way of royalties and other debts:—

Creation and Issue of Adhesive Stamps.

Sections 10 and 11 of the Stamp Duties Act, 1923, vest the authority for the creation of stamps for revenue and postage purposes in the Stamp Duties Department, whilst the creation of stamps by the Postmaster-General for postage purposes only is permitted by section 13 of the Post and Telegraph Act, 1928.

In August, 1935, the then Prime Minister advised the Audit Office that it had been decided to entrust the sole creation of adhesive stamps for revenue and postage purposes to the Post and Telegraph Department, and he promised that any necessary legislation would be placed before Parliament during the next ensuing session.

The omission to present the necessary measure during the session of 1935 was the subject of comment in the Controller and Auditor-General's report of last year, and I have again to draw attention to the fact that the change of control has not yet been sanctioned by Parliament.

Audit of Accounts of Public Stores.

During the year Stores Audit Inspectors made inspections of 349 financial and store accounts in the following Government Departments: Prisons, Public Works, Health, Printing and Stationery, Naval Defence, Defence, Air Department, Education, Marine, Mines, State Forest Service, Industries and Commerce, Tourist and Publicity, Agriculture, Legislative, Police, Mental Hospitals, Native, Railway Workshops and Stores, Post and Telegraph Workshops and Stores, Lands and Survey, Internal Affairs, Scientific and Industrial Research, and External Affairs.

More offices and accounts were inspected than in the previous year, but owing to the increase in departmental activities and the shortage of trained officers it has not been possible to examine all the accounts subject to audit by this Branch. All matters arising out of inspections and calling for comment have been brought to the notice of the Departments concerned and the Treasury and, where necessary, suggestions have been made for the improvement of the systems in force in respect to the financial accounts and accounting for Government stores.

A continuous audit of the expenditure and the financial and store accounts of the New Zealand Division of the Royal Navy has been carried out, but owing to an increase in the accounting work of the Naval Defence Department it has not been possible to keep this section of the work as up to date as I would desire. It is proposed to remedy the position by an increase in the staff.

I am pleased to be able to report that the examinations carried out by this Branch did not disclose any major defalcations in connection with public moneys or stores. Certain irregularities regarding Government stores and the use of services for private purposes were reported during the year, but in practically every case the irregularities were attributable to insufficient supervision being exercised over the officers concerned.

Departments generally are fully alive to the necessity for keeping accurate store and cost accounts, and, on the whole, have complied with the provisions of the Departmental Stores Rules and Regulations, Treasury Regulations, Stores Control Board Regulations, and the Public Revenues Act, 1926, in connection with the accounting for public moneys and stores. The Departments have afforded the Audit Office every assistance in the discharge of its duties.

Audit of Accounts of Local Authorities.

I am pleased to report that the satisfactory position with regard to the auditing of the accounts of local authorities has been well maintained during the year. In only one or two districts were the arrears of work at the 31st March last of any moment.

Last year attention was drawn to the fact that it was desirable that County Councils should be given the power to establish depreciation and renewal funds in respect of plant and other depreciable assets. By section 20 of the Statutes Amendment Act, 1936, County Councils were given power to set aside moneys to establish funds for the repair, renewal, replacement, &c., of property, plant, fixtures, or appliances vested in them, or for purchasing additional such property. In view of the fact that the daily-plant-hire rates fixed by the Main Highways Board in connection with the calculation of subsidy to local authorities include an allowance for depreciation of the plant, the Audit Office is of opinion that it would be desirable for legislation to be enacted to make it compulsory, in every case where a main-highway subsidy is received, for the County Council or other local authority receiving the subsidy to set aside moneys to establish a renewal fund in respect of the plant used on the main highways.

Recently a committee has been set up by the Municipal Association of New Zealand to investigate the desirability of the standardization of the accounts of municipal corporations, and to suggest improvements to the existing methods of recording the financial transactions and of presenting the accounts of such bodies. There has been a need for more uniformity in the form of presenting local authority accounts, and the Audit Office has notified the association that it is prepared to give any necessary assistance in connection with the matter. The question of standardization could be extended to other classes of local authority with considerable advantage.

In a previous report reference was made to the practice of local-body members signing blank cheque forms and leaving the details to be filled in by the respective officials concerned, and also to the dangers arising therefrom. While there has been an improvement in the position since then, instances are still being reported to the Audit Office where the practice obtains. However, in all cases where the existence of the practice has come to the notice of the Audit Office action has been taken to ensure that it is discontinued.

As stated last year, difficulty has been experienced at arriving at any decision as to what is the reasonable additional cost of holding an election of members of a Harbour Board or an Electric-power Board when it is held simultaneously with an election of members of Borough or County Councils, and as to what proportions of the cost of preparing and printing the district electors' roll of a Borough Council are to be borne under the provisions of section 16 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1933, by other local authorities entitled to use the roll. A Supreme Court decision during the year clarified the position in the latter regard somewhat, but the position is still unsatisfactory, and the previous remarks in regard to the situation are still applicable.

During the year many questions arose in connection with the travellingallowances and refunds of expenses payable to members of local authorities in respect of their attendance at meetings of or their travelling on business of the local authorities, and it has become more and more apparent to the Audit Office that the entire statutory provisions and regulations relating to such allowances and expenses require revising. Not only do the provisions vary widely from class to class of local authority and require placing upon a uniform basis, but also anomalies exist through the fact that many of the regulations, having been drawn up many years ago before the more recent developments in transport methods, are not entirely suitable for present-day conditions.

During the year fourteen members of local authorities were notified by the Audit Office that they had automatically forfeited their seats on account of their having been concerned or interested in contracts of the local authorities of which they were members. In these cases the disqualifications arose under the provisions of the Local Authorities (Members' Contracts) Act, 1934. In one other case a member of a local authority was disqualified on account of his holding a place of profit under or in the gift of the local authority. In each case the Audit Office took appropriate action in regard to the matter. In two cases legislation was subsequently introduced that validated the irregularities and enabled the gentlemen concerned to continue as members of their respective local authorities. In one case the validating legislation was introduced because of an anomaly in the Local Authorities (Members' Contracts) Act having worked the disqualification, and the other case was validated because of the peculiar circumstances having operated to constitute an exceptional hardship on the member concerned.

When the Local Authorities (Members' Contracts) Act, 1934, was passed it was anticipated by the Audit Office that the passing of the Act would remove many of the anomalies that previously existed in regard to the disqualification of members of local authorities. However, although the consolidation in this Act of the provisions relating to disqualification of members contracting with their local authorities was an undoubted improvement on the earlier state of affairs, difficulties have been experienced by local-body members, who do not generally have expert knowledge of the law, in interpreting some of these provisions. Many of the large number of disqualifications during the past year can be attributed to this cause, and it is felt desirable that action should be taken to have the provisions regarding the disqualification of local-body members set out more fully and clearly. It is

understood that the matter is receiving consideration.

The Audit Office dealt during the year with seven cases involving the misappropriation of moneys by local-body officials or cash shortages in local-body offices. In each of six of the cases the matter was placed in the hands of the police for the appropriate action by them. In the seventh case no action could be taken in view of the death of the officer responsible before the discovery of the shortage. The total aggregate sum of all the misappropriations and shortages during the year was £1,508 19s. 4d., and the largest misappropriation by any one official involved a sum of £598 2s. 10d. In another case the amount involved was £390 6s. 9d.

The Audit Office was called upon to deal with numerous breaches of the law relating to the accounts of local authorities, and those which actually resulted during the year in the qualification of the certificates of the Audit Office to those accounts are detailed below (Schedule A).

Attention was drawn in Audit certificates during the year to the following matters which relate to the accounts of local authorities, but which are not breaches of law (Schedule B).

In each case where the Audit Office was required to take action an adjustment of accounts or a recovery of moneys, as the case might be, was obtained, except where a satisfactory explanation was made or where in view of the special circumstances of the case an adjustment or recovery was waived conditionally on legislation being introduced to validate the irregularities. A list of the special cases where the waiver conditional upon the obtaining of legislation was granted is set out below (Schedule C).

Surcharges.

The Controller and Auditor-General is required by section 69 of the Public Revenues Act, 1926, to surcharge any officer who may be considered responsible for the loss of public moneys or stores. I have again found it necessary to issue a number of surcharges on account of monetary losses from the Employment Promotion Fund, and during the year twelve such surcharges were issued against officers of the Labour Department (Employment Division). The amount involved in these surcharges totalled £446 12s. 7d., of which £1 10s. was confirmed by the Minister of Finance and the balance remitted by the Minister under the authority contained in section 71 of the Public Revenues Act, 1926. I mentioned in my last report that I

am fully aware of the difficulties which the Labour Department is experiencing in the administration of the employment-promotion legislation, and I recognize that in some cases reasonable excuse exists for error. The Audit Office has no alternative under existing legislation but to impose surcharges despite the circumstances, but no surcharge may be imposed without the right of recourse to the Minister of Finance by way of appeal.

An officer of the Post and Telegraph Department was surcharged with a loss amounting to £16 10s. following upon an irregular withdrawal from the Post Office Savings-bank. The Minister of Finance relieved the officer concerned to the extent of £15 10s. and partially confirmed the surcharge by imposing a nominal penalty of £1.

Certain surcharges were mentioned last year as being unsatisfied, and I have to report that the following action has been taken with regard to them:—

Of the surcharges amounting to £233 8s. 3d. against officers of the Labour Department, £9 1s. 11d. was recovered on account of the overpayments, £223 6s. 4d. was remitted as a result of appeals to the Minister of Finance, and £1 was confirmed by way of penalty.

The loss sustained by the Pensions Department is being liquidated by instalments, and action in connection with the surcharge is meantime

being withheld by the Minister.

The surcharges imposed upon officers of the Government Life Insurance Department and the Public Works Department have been remitted by the Minister.

From the foregoing statement which I am required to present in terms of section 89 (2) (c) of the Public Revenues Act, 1926, it will be seen that a very satisfactory feature of the accounts under review is the diminution in the number of cases of misappropriations by officers of the Public Service.

Nine cases of irregularities involving the theft of public moneys and stores by Government officials came under the notice of the Audit Office during the year, and it is satisfactory to know that the losses in these cases were not attributable to any deficiencies in the regulations and instructions governing accounting procedure.

The largest sum embezzled in any one case was £390 8s. 8d., which amount was misappropriated by an officer who controlled an Accounts Section in the Public Trust Office in Wellington. This fraud was perpetrated by the aid of forgery, and an investigation of the case revealed that the accounting methods are satisfactory. The Supreme Court sentenced the offender to reformative detention for a period of two years. It is anticipated that portion of the moneys will be recovered.

An officer of the Post and Telegraph Department stationed at the High Street Post-office, Christchurch, appeared before the Magistrate's Court for failure to account for registration levies amounting to £101. He was admitted to probation for two

years on condition that he made restitution within fourteen days.

In addition to the irregularities in which departmental officers were involved, numerous thefts were committed by persons other than departmental officers. An unsatisfactory feature is the large increase in the number of cases in which moneys have been obtained from the Employment Promotion Fund by means of false pretences. In the course of the year, 1,961 such cases were reported in connection with which moneys totalling £11,267 5s. 4d. had been paid from the Fund. The Department has effected considerable improvement in the direction of increasing the staff of inspecting officers whose duties are to satisfy themselves by appropriate means of the correctness and of the propriety of the transactions embodied in the accounts.

I desire to take this opportunity of placing on record the loss which the Dominion has sustained as a result of the death, on 3rd March, 1937, of my predecessor, Colonel G. F. C. Campbell. Colonel Campbell, who was in office during almost the whole of the period to which this report relates, had a distinguished career in the Public Service of this Dominion extending over a period of nearly sixty-three years, during which time he filled many responsible positions with credit, including that of Controller and Auditor-General for over fifteen years.
