VOTES, No. 7, WEDNESDAY, APRIL 30, 1856.

4. Sir George Grey's Land Regulations:—Mr. Brown, pursuant to (amended) notice, moved, That a Select Committee be appointed to enquire into alleged malpractices connected with the administration of Sir George Grey's Land Regulations of the 4th March, 1853, with power to call for persons and papers; the Committee to consist of Major Greenwood, Mr. Stafford, Mr. Featherston, Mr. Ludlam, Mr. Sewell, Mr. Cargill, and the mover; and to report to this House this day week.

Question put and passed.

VOTES, No. 14, FRIDAY, MAY 9, 1856.

17. Postponement:—On motion of Mr. Charles Brown, Chairman of the Committee on Sir George Grey's Land Regulations, the report of the Committee was postponed until this day fortnight.

VOTES, No. 17, WEDNESDAY, MAY 14, 1856.

3. Receivers of Public Revenue:—Mr. Fox, pursuant to notice, moved that the returns laid upon the table relative to the defalcation of public officers, and the amount of security given by officers receiving the public revenue, be referred to the "Committee on Sir George Grey's Land Regulations and other matters."
