Note.—This Gazette contains the substance of Informations received in cases of Felony and of Misdemeanors and against Receivers of stolen goods, reputed Thieves and Offenders escaped from custody, with the time, place, and circumstances of the Offence; the Names of persons known, but not in custody, who are charged with Offences, and descriptions of those who are not known, their appearance, dress, and other marks of identity; the Names of Accomplices and Accessories, with every particular which may lead to their apprehension; a description, as accurate as possible, of property that has been stolen, and a minute description of stolen horses, &c., for the purpose of tracing and recovering them.

Stolen.

STOLEN, from the person of William McDonald, at Lodge's Dining-rooms, between the 2nd and 5th ultimo, seven pounds, in bank notes, numbers and banks not known. Timothy Gleeson suspected; he is an Irishman, 35 years of age, 5 feet 9 or 10 inches high, medium build, dark complexion, dark hair, cheeks shaved, black beard and moustache, worn American fashion; dressed in dark trousers, blue shirt, dark tweed coat and a dirty white wide-awake hat; formerly a member of the Canterbury Constabulary.

George Osborn and Frank Mountain are suspected of stealing numbers 1 and 2 on this month's list of horses, &c., stolen. Osborn is about 40 years of age, 6 feet 1 or 2 inches high, stout clumsy build, fresh complexion, round features, fair hair, small fair whiskers, a little hair on chin, clumsy awkward gait; a horse dealer. Mountain is about 40 years of age, 5 feet 10 inches high, clean face, very much wrinkled, has the appearance of a low jockey or horse dealer. Both these men drove a mob of horses from Christchurch to Hokitika. On the morning after their departure the horses were missed.

STOLEN, from William Walker, London street, Lyttelton, a pair of sea boots, made wide to go over trousers, and to reach nearly to the knee; no nails in soles but three rows of wooden pegs, some figures, not known, in ink on the soles.

Stolen, from a bag on board the p. s. Comerang, about three weeks ago, during the passage from Lyttelton to Christchurch, the property of Edward Sofley, a gold Albert chain, engraved curb pattern, with appendages consisting of a twisted bar with nobs at each end, a twisted wire watch key, a piece of green stone about an inch long, and a gold split ring, a pair of blue cloth military trousers torn at the forks, a white military flannel shirt, marked with three figures in red ink. Samuel Rainford, who was on board the steamer when the articles were stolen, is suspected; he is described as about 18 years old, no further description given; supposed to be employed at the Police Barracks, Dunedin.

Stolen, from a stable at the Ohoko Road, near Kaiapoi, on the night of the 16th ult., the property of Samuel Bradley, a large horse collar, newly lined with check, stuffing fuller on the near side than the other; one pair of wooden hames, iron plated, where the staples go through broken off.

STOLEN, during the night of the 20th ultimo, from a hut on the Ferry Road, the property of John Smithson,

an English made pigskin saddle, repaired in several places, the stirrup leathers recently repaired, the irons are very rusty.

Stolen, from the dwelling of William Long, Lincoln Road, Christchurch, between the 6th and 9th ultimo, six one pound notes, banks and numbers not known. John Grapley suspected; he is an Englishman, 27 years of age, 5 feet 7 inches high, medium build, fair complexion, fair hair, whiskers, beard and moustache, Roman nose; dressed in moleskin trousers, dark coat and wide-awake hat.

Inquests.

An inquest was held at Christchurch, on the 11th November, 1868, before J. W. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Alexander Troup, aged six weeks. Verdict—"Died from natural causes."

An inquest was held at the Ashburton, on the 23rd ultimo, on the body of Henrietta Ellen Rose, aged two years and one month. Verdict—"Accidentally drowned."

An inquest has been held at Leithfield, on the 28th ultimo, before C. Dudley, Esq., Coroner, on the body of William Orchard, aged thirty years. Verdict—"Natural Causes."

A WARRANT has been issued by the Christchurch Bench for the apprehension of the person described below, charged with forging the name of R. H. Rhodes to a cheque for £9 10s., on the Bank of Australasia, and uttering the same to William Cuddon, Tuam street, Christchurch:—A female, about 23 years of age, 5 feet 5 inches high, medium build, pale thin features, dark hair and large chignon, genteel appearance; wore a brown dress, black silk jacket, and brown hat with gossamer fall.

WILLIAM JAMES ALEXANDER is charged on warrant, issued by the Bench at Christchurch, for refusing to support his illegitimate male child by Maria M*Connell. He is a native of County Down, Ireland, farm labourer, about 28 years of age, 6 feet high, stout build, fair complexion, fair hair, beard and moustache, blue eyes, round features, high forehead, straight nose, medium chin, mouth rather large, regular teeth, round shoulders, slovenly gait; general appearance that of a labourer.

A WARRANT has been issued by the Bench at Christchurch for the apprehension of the person described below, for having violently assaulted Ann Pannett on the banks of the Avon, opposite the Carlton Hotel, Papanui. A lad, about sixteen years of age, 5 feet 7 or 8 inches high, fair complexion, medium build, dressed in light trousers, dark coat, and lightcoloured cap, much soiled.

John Martin, alias Wylie, is charged on warrant, issued by the Timaru Bench, with obtaining by false pretences, at Temuka, in this province, from John Kahu (a Maori), a chesnut mare, saddle, and bridle, since recovered. The offender is about twenty-seven years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, fair complexion, light hair, sandy whiskers and moustache, grey eyes, thin sharp features, Roman nose, dressed in dark cloth jacket, Bedford cord trousers, brown leather gaiters, with four buckles on the outside, lace-up boots, and old cabbage-tree hat, with black ribbon. Crossed the upper Ferry, Waitangi, on the 9th ult., under the name of J. F. Hurs, and stated he was going to McLean's station. It is likely he will make for Lake Wanaka or the Dunstan, where he is well known.

SERVICE.—Deserted on the 22nd instant, from H.M.I. 14th Regiment at Hobart Town, private Robert Robert Smith, No. 1508, thirty-eight years old, 5 feet 8\frac{3}{4} inches high, fresh complexion, brown hair, hazel eyes; native place, Brunley; enlisted at Manchester; trade, a butcher; wore plain clothes. Supposed to have sailed for Auckland, New Zealand, per Bella Mary, on the 24th inst.

Information is requested respecting William Lambert or Lambourne, per Henry Porcher, 1835. He is about fifty-eight years of age, 5 feet 6 inches high, has a large triangular scar on centre of forehead, caused by the kick of a horse. Lambert received a ticket of leave in the month of February, 1856, for the district of Goulburn. Information to the Inspector General of Police.

Information is requested respecting John Albert Lovell, who left his father's house at Sydney in the year 1858, and was last heard of on the Namoi River in 1861, when he requested his letters to be addressed to John Corrigan, Namoi River. Description of Lovell at the time he left home:—About sixteen years of age, 5 feet high, fair complexion, round face, light hair, light hazel eyes, a native of Somersetshire, England. He is said to have entered the services of a Mr. Barthaino, of the Cross Marsh, soon after his arrival in the colony, and remained in the same employ until 1844. This inquiry is made by his son George.

WILLIAM MAXWELL, aged 28, dark complexion, very sore eyes, 5 feet 8 inches high. Left Adelaide Hospital on the 13th October, 1868, was last heard of at the Exeter Hotel, Adelaide, on the 1st instant. He is well known at Wallaroo, where he has been employed in the smelting works; he also follows the

occupation of a shepherd. This enquiry is made at the instigation of his brother Richard Maxwell.

Information is requested respecting John Reilly, present age about 40, 5 feet 7 inches high, dark complexion, hazel eyes, good teeth, usually wears beard and whiskers; a County Cavan man, farmer. He returned thence to Melbourne with about £300. He is likely to have gone to New Zealand, 6th October, 1868.

Information is requested respecting Bertram Lespinasse de Wilton, aged 29, 5 feet 8 inches high, strong and active, fair complexion, blue eyes, dark eyebrows, bright light brown hair, full beard, &c., stammering speech, reserved and gentle manners, and steady habits, though changeable as to his mode of life. He is supposed to have joined the "Offley" on a whaling expedition from Hobart Town, under the name of William Wallace, 21st October, 1868.
