Note.—This Gazette contains the substance of Informations received in cases of Felony and of Misdemeanors and against Receivers of stolen goods, reputed Thieves and Offenders escaped from custody, with the time, place, and circumstances of the Offence; the Names of persons known, but not in custody, who are charged with Offences, and descriptions of those who are not known, their appearance, dress, and other marks of identity; the Names of Accomplices and Accessories, with every particular which may lead to their apprehension; a description, as accurate as possible, of property that has been stolen, and a minute description of stolen horses, &c., for the purpose of tracing and recovering them.

- 1. Police Gazette.—Communications for this Gazette should be addressed to the Commissioner of Police, prepaid; they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. Officers in charge of stations are requested to report to the Commissioner of Police every instance of the non-delivery of the Gazette, and to suggest from time to time such alterations in the addresses and in the mode of transmission as may be considered necessary.
- 2. Warrants.—Whenever it is desired that any individual, whose name is given, shall be apprehended, it should be stated in the advertisement for the Gazette whether or not a warrant has been issued for the apprehension of the Offender. When a warrant has not been issued in the first instance, any subsequent report announcing the issue of a warrant, should refer to it in the Police Gazette.
- 3. Names.—It is particularly requested that in all Informations, the names of persons and places may be spelt correctly, and written legibly, the Christian name being given with the Surname, and written in full, to prevent mistakes.
- 4. Stray Cattle.—No advertisement of lost horses or cattle, will be published in this Gazette unless they be Government property, but notices of horses or cattle believed to be stolen, will be inserted gratuitously.
- 5. PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—The brands of horses and cattle should be imitated as nearly as possible, and their exact position given. In describing watches, it

- should be stated whether they are open-faced, hunting, double-cased, or half-hunting,—the term "double-cased" being reserved for those watches whose outer ease is removed in order to wind; "half-hunting" implying a very small glass in the middle of the dial.
- 6. Rewards.—No rewards must be accepted by the Members of the Force without the sanction of the Commissioner of Police. When such claims are made, a full report of the circumstances must accompany the application. They will not be allowed, except in cases where meritorious actions showing unusual ability take place, or when they have been sanctioned by Legislative enactment.
- 7. Previous References.—It is requested that in all reports respecting cases already gazetted, Officers in charge of Police, or others concerned, will be good enough to quote the date and page of the Police Gazette in which the previous notice has appeared, and, in reporting arrests, to state by whom effected. Supplementary reports of cases already reported, but not gazetted, should contain such information as will clearly identify the case.
- 8. Telegrams.—In telegrams, the use of figures must be avoided, and words at full length substituted. In forwarding the brands of horses and cattle per telegraph, it should be stated of what kind of letters, the brands consist, whether of Roman capitals, or in writing, &c.

### Stolen.

Stolen, from the premises of Thomas Ellis, Halfway House, Moeraki Downs, on the night of the 11th ultimo, two twenty-eight lb. tins of white paint, of which no description can be given.

Between the 28th November, 1868, and 14th ult., the dwelling house of Wm. Tindall, Church Bush, Kaiapoi, was feloniously entered and the following articles stolen therefrom:—Forty Ibs. of flour; half-pound of tea; four lbs. of sugar; half-pound of tobacco; one large red blanket; one blue pilot-cloth overcoat, with horn buttons, no lining to sleeves, two pockets with flaps, and two breast pockets; one old axe; one pair of white moleskin trousers; two blue striped florentine shirts, with collars; one spade having a new short handle. Maoris living in the neighbourhood are suspected.

STOLEN, from off a fence on the Lincoln Road, where it was placed to dry, the property of Julia Burns, a light print dress, wheat ear pattern.

Inquests.

An Inquest was held on the 30th November, 1868, at Leithfield, before C. Dudley, Esq., Coroner, on the body of William Orchard, aged 30 years. Verdict—Natural causes.

An Inquest was held on the 2nd ultimo, at Courtney, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of John Beatty, aged 55 years. Verdict—Accidental death.

An Inquest was held at Avonside, on the 3rd ultimo, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Thomas Moncrieff, aged 14 years. Verdict—Found drowned.

An Inquest was held at Timaru, on the 8th ult., before B. Woollcombe, Esq., Coroner, into the origin of a fire that occurred in the workshop of Daniel Munroe, at Timaru, by which several buildings in the township were totally destroyed. Verdict—Accidental. "The Jury wish to express their opinion, that greater care might have been used on the part of Mr. D. Munroe, with regard to the stove in his workshop where the fire originated."

An Inquest was held at the Hurunui on the 19th ultimo, before Hugh McIlraith, Esq., Coroner, on the body of William Barnett, aged 15 years. Verdict—Accidentally killed.

An Inquest was held at Christchurch on the 28th ultimo, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of John Henry Percival, aged 7 months. Verdict—Died from natural causes, accelerated through neglect.

An Inquest was held at Sumner on the 30th ultimobefore J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of William McCormack, aged 46 years. Verdict—Accidental death.

AT an adjourned Inquest held at Christchurch on the 31st ult., before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Maria Hackett, aged 20 years, who died

from taking noxious drugs, for the purpose of procuring abortion. The Inquest Jury returned the following verdict—Manslaughter against Thomas Yates, but not sufficient evidence to inculpate Dr. Motley.

### Missing Friends.

Information is requested respecting one Thomas Saunders, last heard of by letter dated February, 1857, at Wellan, Bendigo, Post Office, Sandhurst, Victoria. Supposed to have purchased some land near Adelaide. This information is sought for at the instance of the Superintendent, Wellington, New Zealand.

Information is requested respecting Robert Johnston, who lived near Christchurch, Canterbury Province, about 3 years since, where his father had a farm. Description, about 23 years of age, 5 feet 9 inches high, fair complexion, dark hair, small moustache and beard, blind of left eye. Is likely to be employed as a farm servant.
