

1. COMMUNICATIONS.—All official communications from any district or station in connection with this department, whether by telegraph or otherwise, should be forwarded direct to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.

2. POLICE GAZETTE.—Communications for this GAZETTE should be addressed to the COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, prepaid; they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. Officers in charge of stations are requested to report to the Commissioner of Police every instance of the non-delivery of the GAZETTE, and to suggest from time to time such alterations in the addresses and in the mode of transmission as may be considered necessary.

3. WARRANTS.—Whenever it is desired that any individual, whose name is given, shall be apprehended, it should be stated in the advertisement for the GAZETTE whether or not a warrant has been issued for the apprehension of the Offender. When a warrant has not been issued in the first instance, any subsequent report announcing the issue of a warrant should refer to it in the POLICE GAZETTE.

4. NAMES.—It is particularly requested that in all Informations the names of persons and places may be spelt correctly, and written legibly, the Christian name being given with the Surname, and written in full, to prevent mistakes.

5. STRAY CATTLE.—No advertisement of lost horses or cattle will be published in this GAZETTE, unless they be Government property, but notices of horses or cattle believed to be stolen will be inserted gratuitously.

6. PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—The brands of horses and cattle should be imitated as nearly as possible, and their exact position given. In describing watches, it should be stated whether they are open-faced, hunting, double-cased, or half-hunting,—the term "double-cased" being reserved for those watches whose outer case is removed in order to wind; "half-hunting" implying a very small glass in the middle of the dial.

7. REWARDS.—No rewards must be accepted by the Members of the Force without the sanction of the Commissioner of Police. When such claims are made, a full report of the circumstances must accompany the application. They will not be allowed except in cases where meritorious actions showing unusual ability take place, or when they have been sanctioned by Legislative enactment.

8. PREVIOUS REFERENCES.—It is requested that in all reports respecting cases already gazetted, Officers in charge of Police, or others concerned, will be good enough to quote the date and page of the POLICE GAZETTE in which the previous notice has appeared, and, in reporting arrests, to state by whom effected. Supplementary reports of cases already reported, but not gazetted, should contain such information as will clearly identify the case.

9. TELEGRAMS.—In telegrams, the use of figures must be avoided, and words at full length substituted. In forwarding the brands of horses and cattle per telegraph, it should be stated of what kind of letters the brands consist, whether of Roman capitals or in writing, &c.

STOLEN, from Mr. Hancock's office, Albion Brewery, Christchurch, during the night of the 12th March, 1874, seven florins and two shillings in silver. A watch and cheque which were on the table in the office were left untouched.

Not identifiable.

STOLEN, at 9.45 a.m., on the 23rd March, 1874, a silver geneva hunting watch, with white dial, "Ann Georgina" scratched in back, black guard with gold earring and gold cross attached; the property of Frederick King. Identifiable. Rasmus Jongusen, a Dane, 21 years, 5ft. 7in., stout build, pale complexion, dark hair and eyes, cut scar on chin, dressed in black wideawake hat, black coat, grey trousers and vest, Blucher boots, is suspected.

STOLEN, from the South Rakaia, about the 15th February, 1874, a light bay draught gelding, about five years old, 16 hands high, blaze down face, broad across the hips, sleepy looking, no brands; quiet and easily caught; the property of Julian Jackson, Corwar, South Rakaia.

STOLEN between 12 midnight 19th, and 7 a.m. 20th March, 1874, at Ashburton. two men's new white calico shirts, wristbands cut off, 1 pair reversible shirt cuffs, 1 old single twill bed sheet, seam up the middle from top to bottom, 1 lady's night gown of new calico, frill round wrists and neck, and insertion down the front, 1 child's new calico chemise, plain, 1 small Turkish towel; value £1 14s 6d. All identifiable. The property of Mr. Doherty, Postmaster.

REVERTING to Criminal Offences dated Christchurch, 18th March, 1874, Mr. Morgan's horses therein described have been found in Christchurch pound.

REVERTING to Criminal Offences, dated Christchurch, 19th March, 1874, Mr. Worger's saddle and bridle therein described have been found in an adjoining paddock, not stolen, having been placed there in mistake by Mr. Worger.

REVERTING to Criminal Offences, dated Timaru, 27th March, 1874, the mare therein described has been found by Mr. Bailey, the owner, straying, not stolen.

— SAUL, christian name unknown, is charged on warrant with obtaining goods by false pretences, from Mr. Fuhrmann, of Christchurch. Description: 5ft. 9 or 10in. high, medium build, about 34 or 35 years, fair hair, beard, whiskers, and moustache worn short; smart active gait; dressed in black alpaca coat, dark vest and trousers, black deerstalker hat; was at one time on board the steamer *Luna*.

WILLIAM TERRY, English, 16 years, 5ft. 4 or 5in., medium build, dark complexion and hair, no whiskers, dressed in tweed trousers, old Blucher boots (supposed), blue cap with French peak, and carrying a sailor's bag, is charged with deserting from the barque *Cyrene*, during the night of the 24th of March, 1874. Capt. Wood offers 30s. for his arrest if captured before the vessel leaves for Newcastle.

Missing Friends.

INFORMATION is required as to the whereabouts of James Smart, Irish, about 36 years of age, 5ft. 6in., stout build, fair complexion, perceptible though slight lameness of left leg, caused by a sprain. Smart left Auckland in August last, and was heard of from Christchurch in October; since then all letters addressed to him remain at the Post Office, Christchurch, uncalled for. His aged mother is in great distress about him. Information to be sent to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.

ABOUT midnight on the 25th March, 1874, the straw around a threshing machine belonging to Mr. Colville, who was threshing wheat on the farm of Mr. Gladstone, at Orari, was discovered to be on fire. The men being quickly aroused by Robert Moulton, succeeded in saving the engine and combine, but the elevator was destroyed. No suspicion attaches to any one. The machine was insured in the New Zealand Insurance Company's Office, at Timaru—the engine, £150; combine, £150; and elevator, £10.

BETWEEN the hours of 5 p.m. 24th, and 7 a.m. 25th March, 1874, a ferret, the property of Mr. Wilfrid Constable Maxwell, which was in a cage in the yard of the Criterion Hotel, Timaru, was killed by a dog. The ferret could not have got out of the cage itself, as the door was found closed. Mr. Maxwell offers a reward of £5 for the discovery of the offender.
