1. COMMUNICATIONS.—All official communications from any district or station in connection with this department, whether by telegraph or otherwise, should be forwarded direct to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.

2. POLICE GAZETTE.—Communications for this GAZETTE should be addressed to the COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, prepaid; they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. Officers in charge of stations are requested to report to the Commissioner of Police every instance of the non-delivery of the GAZETTE, and to suggest from time to time such alterations in the addresses and in the mode of transmission as may be considered necessary.

3. WARRANTS.—Whenever it is desired that any individual, whose name is given, shall be apprehended, it should be stated in the advertisement for the GAZETTE whether or not a warrant has been issued for the apprehension of the Offender. When a warrant has not been issued in the first instance, any subsequent report announcing the issue of a warrant should refer to it in the POLICE GAZETTE.

4. NAMES.—It is particularly requested that in all Informations the names of persons and places may be spelt correctly, and written legibly, the Christian name being given with the Surname, and written in full, to prevent mistakes.

5. STRAY CATTLE.—No advertisement of lost horses or cattle will be published in this GAZETTE, unless they be Government property, but notices of horses or cattle believed to be stolen will be inserted gratuitously.

6. PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—The brands of horses and cattle should be imitated as nearly as possible, and their exact position given. In describing watches, it should be stated whether they are open-faced, hunting, double-cased, or half-hunting,—the term "double-cased" being reserved for those watches whose outer case is removed in order to wind; "half-hunting" implying a very small glass in the middle of the dial.

7. REWARDS.—No rewards must be accepted by the Members of the Force without the sanction of the Commissioner of Police. When such claims are made, a full report of the circumstances must accompany the application. They will not be allowed except in cases where meritorious actions showing unusual ability take place, or when they have been sanctioned by Legislative enactment.

8. PREVIOUS REFERENCES.—It is requested that in all reports respecting cases already gazetted, Officers in charge of Police, or others concerned, will be good enough to quote the date and page of the POLICE GAZETTE in which the previous notice has appeared, and, in reporting arrests, to state by whom effected. Supplementary reports of cases already reported, but not gazetted, should contain such information as will clearly identify the case.

9. TELEGRAMS.—In telegrams, the use of figures must be avoided, and words at full length substituted. In forwarding the brands of horses and cattle per telegraph, it should be stated of what kind of letters the brands consist, whether of Roman capitals or in writing, &c.

Stolen.

STOLEN, from a meat safe on the premises of Mr. Henry Allchin, Christchurch, on the 8th August, 1874, two fowls, and seven-and-a-half pounds of steak; also, a wooden wash-tub. John Jebson, English, 5ft. 4 or 5in., stout build, fair complexion, sandy hair, small sandy moustache and goatee; dressed in Scotch cap, blue monkey jacket, moleskin trousers, a shoeblack, still in Christchurch, is suspected.

STOLEN, from the dwelling of Ananias Knudsen, Heathcote Valley, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 1 p.m., on the 13th August, 1874, a pair of light watertight boots, nearly new, a pair of side-spring boots a little worn on outside, a pair of light tweed trousers, a blue cloth ribbed coat, a tweed shirt, a small toothcomb, with a few teeth broken out at the end on one side, and a pair of braces, old and brown from wear. Identifiable. Henry Larsen, a Dutchman, 20 years, 5ft. 4 or 5in., downcast look, sallow complexion, prominent nose, dark blue or grey eyes, brown hair, no whiskers or moustache, a supposed runaway sailor from ship *Wenington*, dressed in short pea jacket, dirty moleskin trousers, and dark blue Scotch cap, is suspected.

STOLEN, from the till of the Golden Age Hotel, Christchurch, between the hours of 6 and 7 p.m., on the 17th August, three or four single notes, bank or numbers unknown. Not identifiable.

STOLEN, from the shop of Edward George, High Street, Christchurch, about 5.30 p.m., on the 18th instant, a pair of No. 6 size, sewn watertight shooting boots, not nailed. Identifiable.

STOLEN, from C. T. Kingsworth, at the Halkett Hotel, Courtenay, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., on the 24th August, 1874, two one-pound notes, and a cheque on the Bank of New Zealand, Christchurch, for £2 2s., cheque torn in two, name or number unknown. Not identifiable. Robert Morrison, Scotch, 45 years, 5ft. 8 or 9in., dressed in tweed suit, stout build, a barman; and Thomas Taylor, native of Australia, about 25 years of age, 5ft. 7 or 8in., dark complexion, little whiskers, dressed in moleskin trousers, Crimean shirt, and wide-awake hat, a groom, still at Courtenay, are suspected.

HENRY HEBDEN, English, 24 years, 5ft. 5in., thin build, dark complexion, dark eyes, black straight hair, whiskers, and moustache, about 9st. weight, a blacksmith, is charged on warrant filed in Commissioner's office, with neglecting to provide for the maintenance of his two illegitimate children, of whom Alice Hankins is the mother. Was last heard of in Dunedin.

CAPTAIN BLEY, ship *Stonehouse*, offers £1 each for the arrest of the undermentioned deserters from his ship:—August Biger, 5ft. 8in., fair complexion, fair hair, whiskers, and moustache, dressed in Sunday clothes; and John Mulloy, 5ft. 3in., dark hair and whiskers, pock-marked. Missing Friends.

WANTED the whereabouts of William Ford, 8 years old, whose father recently left Christchurch for England. The boy was supposed to have been staying with somebody in Lyttelton, but no trace of him is obtainable there. The inquiry is made at the instance of Elizabeth Morrison, of Dunedin, who will pay the boy's expenses by steamer to Dunedin, if found. Information to be sent to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.

WANTED the whereabouts of William Hannam, or Hannan, a native of Yorkshire, 40 years, 5ft. 10in., dark complexion, inclined to sallow, long features, prominent nose, hazel eyes, dark brown hair, and light brown whiskers and beard, an old scar on right side of mouth, upper lip and cheek, a labourer and shearer; came to this Province from that of Marlborough, some little time ago in company with a man named Roberts, and was working with him near South-bridge. He is now said to be in some of the Bays upon the Peninsula.

INQUIRY should be made as to the present whereabouts of Charles Moore Thurston, of middle age, following the business of a contractor. He is said to have resided in Christchurch same time ago. His wife, in San Francisco, is most anxious to hear from him. Inquiry should be made amongst Freemasons as well as others, and the result communicated to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.

TOM PRICE, present age 23, probably slender and above the average height, hair likely to be auburn and eyes very dark; last heard of in September, 1873, when he was working at a circular saw

mill in Waimate, but then stated his intention of going to Oamaru. He is a nephew of Miss Barnwell, Oriel Cottage, Albury Street, Dunedin, at whose request this inquiry is set on foot. Information to be sent to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.
