1. COMMUNICATIONS.—All official communications from any district or station in connection with this department, whether by telegraph or otherwise, should be forwarded direct to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.

2. POLICE GAZETTE.—Communications for this GAZETTE should be addressed to the COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, prepaid; they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. Officers in charge of stations are requested to report to the Commissioner of Police every instance of the non-delivery of the GAZETTE, and to suggest from time to time such alterations in the addresses and in the mode of transmission as may be considered necessary.

3. WARRANTS.—Whenever it is desired that any individual, whose name is given, shall be apprehended, it should be stated in the advertisement for the GAZETTE whether or not a warrant has been issued for the apprehension of the Offender. When a warrant has not been issued in the first instance, any subsequent report announcing the issue of a warrant should refer to it in the POLICE GAZETTE.

4. NAMES.—It is particularly requested that in all Informations the names of persons and places may be spelt correctly, and written legibly, the Christian name being given with the Surname, and written in full, to prevent mistakes.

5. STRAY CATTLE.—No advertisement of lost horses or cattle will be published in this GAZETTE, unless they be Government property but notices of horses or cattle believed to be stolen will be inserted gratuitously.

6. PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—The brands of horses and cattle should be imitated as nearly as possible, and their exact position given. In describing watches, it should be stated whether they are open-faced, hunting, double-cased, or half-hunting,—the term "double-cased" being reserved for those watches whose outer case is removed in order to wind; "half-hunting" implying a very small glass in the middle of the dial.

7. REWARDS.—No rewards must be accepted by the Members of the Force without the sanction of the Commissioner of Police. When such claims are made, a full report of the circumstances must accompany the application. They will not be allowed except in cases where meritorious actions showing unusual ability take place, or when they have been sanctioned by Legislative enactment.

8. PREVIOUS REFERENCES.—It is requested that in all reports respecting cases already gazetted, Officers in charge of Police, or others concerned, will be good enough to quote the date and page of the POLICE GAZETTE in which the previous notice has appeared, and, in reporting arrests, to state by whom effected. Supplementary reports of cases already reported, but not gazetted, should contain such information as will clearly identify the case.

9. TELEGRAMS.—In telegrams, the use of figures must be avoided, and words at full length substituted. In forwarding the brands of horses and cattle per telegraph, it should be stated of what kind of letters the brands consist, whether of Roman capitals or in writing, &c.

### Stolen.

STOLEN, on the 10th September, 1874, between the hours of 4 and 5 p.m., from the shop of Mr. George Heslop, Whately Road, a brown holland dress, flounced on bottom and a small flounce about half-way up, trimmed with brown braid. Identifiable.

STOLEN, between the 12th August and 8th September, 1874, from the stable belonging to Cassidy and Clarke, at Castle Hill, one sack of chaff, and about one sack and three-quarters of oats. Not identifiable.

STOLEN, from the cab of John McVicker, about 11 p.m., on the 16th September, 1874, a Yankee whip, mounted with five silver ferrules, and a piece of plaited horse hide attached to the end of the whip. Identifiable.

STOLEN, between 1 and 4 p.m. on the 24th September, 1874, from Mr. Thomas Hills, Whately Road, a plain gold keeper ring, with initials H.H. Identifiable. George Becket, 30 years, 5ft. 9in., dark complexion, small dark whiskers, no moustache, red nose, dressed in black stable jacket, dark trousers, billycock hat, who was working about the place, is suspected; still in Christchurch.

LOST OR STOLEN, from the person of E. C. Denny, of Akaroa, on the road between Christchurch and Cashmere, on the 26th September, 1874, a silver hunting lever watch, No. 50778, maker Hackett; a gold twisted link chain, one knob of the bar attached to chain chipped off. Identifiable.

STOLEN, from the person of Peter McManus, of Hazelden Road, between 9 p.m. 28th and 6 a.m. 29th September, 1874, eighteen £1 notes, bank or numbers not known, in a blue bag purse. Purse identifiable.

ALEXANDER FRASER, 35 to 40 years, 5ft. 9in., medium build, fresh complexion, light brown hair, whiskers, and moustache, pretty full and long, two upper front teeth wanting, fond of drink, dressed when last seen in blue coat, light tweed trousers, and light half Yankee hat, is charged on warrant with stealing a black gelding (since recovered), the property of Charles Spalding, on August 18, 1874.
