1. COMMUNICATIONS.—*All official communications from any district or station in connection with this department, whether by telegraph or otherwise, should be forwarded direct to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.*

2. POLICE GAZETTE.—*Communications for this GAZETTE should be addressed to the COMMISSIONER OF POLICE, prepaid; they must be of Police interest, or no notice will be taken of them. Officers in charge of stations are requested to report to the Commissioner of Police every instance of the non-delivery of the GAZETTE, and to suggest from time to time such alterations in the addresses and in the mode of transmission as may be considered necessary.*

3. WARRANTS.—*Whenever it is desired that any individual, whose name is given, shall be apprehended, it should be stated in the advertisement for the GAZETTE whether or not a warrant has been issued for the apprehension of the Offender. When a warrant has not been issued in the first instance, any subsequent report announcing the issue of a warrant should refer to it in the POLICE GAZETTE.*

4. NAMES.—*It is particularly requested that in all Informations the names of persons and places may be spelt correctly, and written legibly, the Christian name being given with the Surname, and written in full, to prevent mistakes.*

5. STRAY CATTLE.—*No advertisement of lost horses or cattle will be published in this GAZETTE, unless they be Government property, but notices of horses or cattle believed to be stolen will be inserted gratuitously.*

6. PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—*The brands of horses and cattle should be imitated as nearly as possible, and their exact position given. In describing watches, it should be stated whether they are open-faced, hunting, double-cased, or half-hunting,—the term "double-cased" being reserved for those watches whose outer case is removed in order to wind; "half-hunting" implying a very small glass in the middle of the dial.*

7. REWARDS.—*No rewards must be accepted by the Members of the Force without the sanction of the Commissioner of Police. When such claims are made, a full report of the circumstances must accompany the application. They will not be allowed except in cases where meritorious actions showing unusual ability take place, or when they have been sanctioned by Legislative enactment.*

8. PREVIOUS REFERENCES.—*It is requested that in all reports respecting cases already gazetted, Officers in charge of Police, or others concerned, will be good enough to quote the date and page of the POLICE GAZETTE in which the previous notice has appeared, and, in reporting arrests, to state by whom effected. Supplementary reports of cases already reported, but not gazetted, should contain such information as will clearly identify the case.*

9. TELEGRAMS.—*In telegrams, the use of figures must be avoided, and words at full length substituted. In forwarding the brands of horses and cattle per telegraph, it should be stated of what kind of letters the brands consist, whether of Roman capitals or in writing, &c.*

Stolen.

STOLEN, from the cash box of Thomas William Barker, Traveller's Rest, Head of the Bay, Akaroa, between 2 and 5 p.m. on the 5th March, 1875, two £10 notes and one £5 note, banks or numbers unknown; not identifiable. Doubtful case.

STOLEN, from a paddock near the Carlton Hotel, between the 21st and 24th February, 1875, a chestnut mare, white hind feet, star on forehead, knee puffed, about fifteen hands high, seven years old, no brands, the property of John Skelton, boarding-house keeper, Christchurch. Identifiable.

STOLEN, from the shop of Edward George, High Street, Christchurch, between 8 and 9 p.m. on the 13th March, 1875, a pair of elastic-side men's boots, size seven, with square toes, and three small buttons on front of each, value 10s. 6d. Identifiable. A German about 29 years, 5ft. 8 or 9in., dark complexion, dark hair, beard, and moustache, blue eyes, long nose, dressed in dark coat and vest, and white trousers, who was loitering about the place, is suspected.

STOLEN, from the person of James Collins, Waimate, at 1 p.m. on the 13th March last, an English silver lever hunting watch, No. 3692, maker's name Dennison, London; and a snake pattern Albert chain, gold washed, no appendages, value £8. Both identifiable.

STOLEN, from the shop of Milner and Thompson, corner of High and Cashel Streets, Christchurch, during the night of the 13th ultimo, a green calico window blind, 12 feet by 4½ feet. Identifiable.

STOLEN, from the Waihi Crossing, between 10 p.m. 27th and 6 a.m. 28th February last, a black draught gelding, white blaze down face, black points, horseshoe brand near shoulder, rising six years old; also, a bay draught gelding, star on forehead, a little white on near hind foot, branded **T R** on both shoulders, the property of Thomas Brown; both horses newly shod all round, and identifiable.

STOLEN, from Skelton's boarding-house, Whately Road, on the 21st February last, a pair of brass earrings, pattern like a pawnbroker's sign, a ball broken off, a black composition brooch, rose, thistle, and shamrock on it, a brass brooch with red glass heart in centre, a brass brooch, red head in centre, a black ribbon belt with brass buckle, a pair women's boots, size six, half worn, blue leather up the front with fancy sewing, a small black net veil, a quantity of linen towels and single sheets, some marked J. Skelton, and some J. S——n, a roll of black silk, good quality. Identifiable; the property of Grace Skelton. Annie Laudrie, native of Cornwall, 30 years, 5ft. 3 or 4in., dark brown hair, grey eyes, high cheek bones, thin build, very straight, a general servant, now living with her brother on the South Town Belt, near Colombo Street, is suspected.

STOLEN, at Ashburton, between 12 noon and 1 p.m. 11th ultimo, a blue morocco pocket-book, with yellow elastic band, the property of John Tresize, containing a clearance card of Queen's Own Lodge of Odd Fellows, Cornwall, two ivory studs, a sixpenny postage stamp, a letter from Victoria, and the death of a child recorded inside book. A man dressed in grey tweed suit, and round stiff black hat, is suspected. Not identifiable.

STOLEN, from a clothes line, between 9 p.m. 18th and 6 a.m. 19th ultimo, two white night-gowns, with single frill round cuffs, and fancy sewing down the fronts; two chemises with a little trimming round the neck, and a grey and white striped plaid shawl, the property of Elizabeth McLeary, Gloucester Street East. Richard Bray, 45 years, 5ft. 6in., stout build, fair complexion, light curly hair, clean shaved, dressed as a labourer, still in Christchurch, is suspected.

STOLEN, at Riccarton, between 11 a.m. and 5 p.m. on the 17th ultimo, a white pocket-handkerchief with a border of black spots, containing three Crimean shirts, one of them shepherd's plaid, two white under flannel shirts, and a pair of drawers, the property of George Doige. Identifiable.

STOLEN, at Lyttelton, on the 21st ultimo, a large dark brown Angola shawl, fringed all round, value £1 10s., the property of W. Donald, Esq., R.M. Identifiable.

STOLEN, from the Clarendon Hotel, Christchurch, between October 1874, and March 1875, four large fiddle-pattern forks, five dessert spoons, do. and six teaspoons, do. two dessert spoons, trade mark B. five dessert spoons, trade mark 2, three table spoons, do. five small forks, do. B, two large spoons, do. B, four large forks, trade mark 2, one teaspoon, trade mark B and 2, two small butter knives, fancy carving on blades, the property of J. S. Wagner; the above articles were silver plated, value about £20. Not identifiable.

STOLEN, from Geraldine, about the 4th October, 1874, a dark bay mare, about 14 hands, branded **T O** on near shoulder, white star on forehead, curly mane, switch tail, supposed to have a foal running at foot, the property of Mrs. Emma Smith. Identifiable.

STOLEN, at Kaiapoi, between 4.30 p.m. 21st and 9 a.m. 22nd ultimo, a nearly new cart saddle, studded with brass headed nails in diamond, value 35s., the property of Benjamin Packwood. Identifiable. An Irishman, having the appearance of a labourer, about 35 years, 5ft. 5in., short black hair, black goatee, no whiskers, dressed in dark blue sac coat, moleskin trousers fastened under the knee with straps, blue cheese-cutter cap, is suspected, as he offered a cart saddle for sale to John Malone, on the North Road, that day for 2s.

STOLEN, from the dwelling of William Zouch, Moeraki Downs, at 7 p.m. on the 13th ultimo, a pair of youth's lace-up boots, fancy fronts, size seven, value 18s. Identifiable. Thomas Cross, English, 24 years, 5ft. 7in., fair complexion, small slight whiskers and moustache, long thin beard worn Yankee fashion, a labourer, still at Moeraki Downs, is suspected.

STOLEN, from Porter's Pass, on the 6th ultimo, a light bay draught mare, blaze down face, long tail, white hind feet, branded S off shoulder. Identifiable; the property of Richard McKay.

STOLEN, from the dwelling of Richard Parish, Shand's Track, Prebbleton, on the 6th ultimo, a small brown morocco leather writing desk, opens like a book, containing a few old receipts, and a marriage certificate of Richard Parish and Caroline Blunden, at St. John's Church, Portsmouth, England, on the 2nd January, 1868. Value of desk 30s; identifiable.

STOLEN, from the dwelling of James Green, Lyttelton, about 8 p.m. on the 22nd ultimo, a black cloth frock coat, nearly new, two side pockets, one button at top, value £2; identifiable. A man, name unknown, about 40 years of age, 6 feet, long sandy whiskers and moustache, slight build, very dirty-looking, dirty tweed trousers and vest, black billycock hat, was supplied with food, and allowed to lie down to rest in Green's house, and decamped with the coat, leaving his own in its place.

A man, name unknown, described as 50 years of age, 5ft. 5in., medium build, light brown hair turning grey, fair whiskers mixed with grey, shaved on chin, wore moustache, dressed in dark sac coat, dark trousers with blue stripes, light felt hat, and having a red handkerchief with white spots, is charged on warrant filed in Commissioner's office, with indecently exposing his person to Edith J. Blake, Armagh Street, at 3 p.m. on the 9th March last. Identifiable.

WILLIAM MURPHY is charged with deserting from H.M.S. *Dido*, at Auckland, on the 10th March last. Capt. Chapman offers £3 reward and expenses for his apprehension. Description:—A.B., 30 years, 5ft. 6in., dark hair and eyes, black whiskers, beard and moustache, round-shouldered, stoops slightly, bow-legged, tattooed, marks unknown, deep sunken eyes, high cheek bones, strong Irish accent.

JAMES BROWN, English, about 34 years, 5ft. 10in., stout build, fair hair and complexion, Yankee beard, dressed in blue sac coat, and moleskin trousers, light-colored hat, water-tight boots, a labourer, is charged on warrant filed in Commissioner's office, with using obscene language in a public place.

THOMAS BENNETT CRESSY, native of London, a butcher, 40 years, 5ft. 6 or 7in., fair hair, whiskers, and moustache, medium build, grey eyes, long straight nose, very talkative, and fond of drink, is charged on warrant filed in Commissioner's office, with deserting his wife Sarah Ann Cressy, at Christchurch, on the 17th December, 1874. Offender is supposed to be at Greymouth.

— BANFILL, a Frenchman, about 35 years of age, about 5ft. 6in., slight build, dark hair, whiskers, and moustache, dressed in dark coat, grey tweed trousers, black billycock hat, no swag, carried a parcel tied up in a handkerchief, is charged on warrant from Westland, with being of unsound mind. Banfill left his home at Totara, near Ross, taking with him a double-barrelled gun, on the 5th ultimo, supposed to be making for Christchurch.

THOMAS B. LEIGHTON, English, 39 years, 5ft. 10in., slight build, fair complexion, fair whiskers, beard and moustache, two or three front teeth missing, lump on back of head near crown, smart active appearance, formerly a grocer in Christchurch, dressed in a blue ribbed coat, tweed trousers and vest, billycock hat, is charged on warrant filed in Commissioner's office, with deserting his wife and family. Offender was supposed to have arrived in Auckland from Wanganui, per s.s. *St. Kilda*, on the 10th ultimo, and to be trying to leave the Colony.

HENRY LEE, English, 38 years, 5ft. 4 or 5in., medium build, dark complexion, shaved on chin, cheeks, and upper lip, black hair, coarse flabby features, formerly a fruit hawker in Christchurch, very fond of drink, and frequenting public houses, dressed in black sac coat, light tweed trousers and vest, billycock hat, is charged on warrant filed in Commissioner's office, with deserting his wife and four children.

THOMAS SIMPSON, English, 30 years, 5ft. 9in., medium build, fresh complexion, sandy hair, whiskers, and moustache, whiskers worn all round, generally dressed in blue coat, light tweed trousers and vest, black billycock hat, a labourer, sometimes works as rough carpenter on railways &c., is charged on warrant filed in Commissioner's office, with larceny as a bailee.

Missing Friends.

INQUIRY is made for the whereabouts of William O'Shea, 30 years, native of Limerick, Ireland, a seaman, who shipped on board the *John Knox*, at Sydney, on the 24th June, 1873, and proceeded to Lyttelton, since when he has not been heard of by any of his friends. Information to be sent to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.

ANXIOUS inquiry is made for George Gibson Richardson, who arrived in Melbourne per ship *Moravia*, in October, 1874; he is a native of London, 34 years of age, 5ft. 6in., very thin build, long pale face, slight brown whiskers and beard, bald on top of head, back hair brown with patches of grey, small hands and feet, very well spoken and educated, gentlemanly demeanour, delicate appearance, a splendid horseman, and fond of boating, at times suffers from slight mental derangement, when he finds it difficult to articulate. Information to be sent to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.

INQUIRY is made for the whereabouts of Randolph Willeford, aged 37 years, looks perhaps younger, short, broad-shouldered and strong looking, brown hair, grey eyes, ruddy brown complexion, face much lined with hard work. He went to Port Chalmers in the *Maori*, on Wednesday, 8th October, 1873, and is said to have been employed in some livery stables, in November, 1873, since when nothing has been heard of him.

WANTED the present whereabouts of John Howard, who about six years ago purchased section 4021, in the Waitangi district. He was then supposed to be of unsound mind, and disappeared, going, it was presumed, into the Otago Province; he was generally known as Cranky Jack Howard. A man named Daniel Brown, who when Howard bought this section, leased the Waitaki ferry, and kept the accommodation house, now occupied by Neil McCowan, is supposed to be the only person likely to know of Howard's whereabouts.

A summons is filed in this office for service upon John Liston, an Irishman from Limerick, a gasfitter by trade, 29 years of age, 5ft. 10in., fair hair, small fair moustache and goatee, generally dressed in grey tweed clothes and round hat, given to drinking. He was boarding with a man named Brown, in Lichfield Street, Christchurch, about three weeks ago, and went up country saying he was going to work at a machine, and would probably be down again in a month. Information to be sent to Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.

REVERTING to *Police Gazette*, No. 4, 1875, page 27, re breaking into Spring's Hotel, and stealing therefrom—one of the watches, No. 12967, has been found in the possession of a man named John Montgomery, who was drinking with Cobb in the hotel on the night of the robbery. Montgomery was arrested by the Selwyn Police, at the Irwell Hotel, where he offered the watch for sale, and has been committed for trial. Nothing of the remainder of the stolen property has been traced. Cobb is now at Geraldine, Timaru District.
