Stolen.

STOLEN at Geraldine, between 6 and 10 p.m. on the 11th ultimo, a blue blanket, much creased, and supposed to be covered with chaff, the property of Robert Hodgson of Ashburton. Identification doubtful.

STOLEN at Christchurch, at 7 a.m. on the 12th ultimo, a silk woollen shirt, white ground with small red flowers on it; on the back the red is run into the white, and has a black spot on right arm, the property of George Brown, Zetland Arms hotel. A man named Jack Campbell about 35 years of age, 6ft., dark hair, red brown bushy beard, whiskers and large moustache, broad shoulders, left hand bandaged up, still in Christchurch, is suspected. Identifiable.

LOST or Stolen on the night of the 11th or morning of the 12th ultimo, a saddle, pigskin seat, hide flaps, square stirrup irons, one white girth full size, has had a good deal of wear, the property of Samuel Needham, Cashel Street, Christchurch. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 19th April last, a small open-faced silver Geneva watch, well worn, white enamel dial, slightly cracked from VI to XII; a rusty steel Albert chain attached, value from 30s. to £2, the property of J. Meikleham of Ashburton, who gave the watch to a man going by the name of Fred Baker, to take to Christchurch to be repaired, and he has decamped with it. Baker is described as English, 36 or 37 years of age, about 5 ft. 5in., stout build, dark brown hair, face clean shaved, stiff upright carriage, a baker by trade, works as a navvy, dressed in

a light tweed suit, and supposed to have gone to Southbridge. Watch identifiable.

STOLEN on the night of the 17th ultimo, a new canvass horse cover, red and black lining inside, two red stripes on the outside, blue stripe up the middle, value 25s., the property of Mr. Edward Knapman, Durham Street, Christchurch. Identifiable.

STOLEN between 7 p.m. on the 18th and 7.30 a.m. on the 19th ultimo, one white canvass blind, 5ft. by 4ft., with 1in. brass ring sewn on each corner of it, the property of Messrs Mason and Struthers, Colombo Street, Christchurch. Identifiable.

STOLEN at Geraldine, at 5 a.m. on the 15th ultimo, a white gander, a grey and white goose, and a white gosling, identification doubtful, the property of Dr. Fish, who suspects one Miller, and Charles Jones, still at Geraldine, brickmakers. Description, Miller, English, 5ft. 6in., stout build, fair hair, beard, whiskers and moustache, dressed in moleskin trowsers, blue pilot coat, black billycock hat. Jones, English, 5ft. 6 or 7in., stout build, dark hair, beard, whiskers and moustache, moleskin trowsers, tweed coat, black billycock hat.

STOLEN from the person of Frederick Steward, whilst drunk at Willis' hotel, Malvern, between 7 p.m. on the 18th and 7 a.m. on the 19th ultimo, seven £1 notes and one English sovereign. Not identifiable.

STOLEN between the 19th and the 21st ultimo, from Uncle Tom's Boarding House,

Christchurch, two shirts; one woollen, nearly new, white with black stripes; the other wool and cotton of many coloured checks, the property of Joseph Anderson, identifiable. Jack Bones, 23 years of age, 5ft. 5 or 6in., stout build, black hair, very black eyes, rather full round face, speaks between a stutter and a lisp, dressed in a shabby suit of light coloured clothes, and low crowned wideawake hat, is suspected. Supposed to have gone in the direction of Kaiapoi.

STOLEN from the shop of Robert Brook, George Street, Dunedin, about the 15th ultimo, a gentleman's gold ring, set with diamonds and a ruby, the latter in the centre, value £50. The diamonds are medium sized, the ruby a size larger; the diamonds are backed up with silver in the setting, causing them to reflect more brightly. Drake, Belcher, Coleman, Lyons, and Lee, all well known betting men and gamblers, are strongly suspected, as they were in the shop the day before the ring was missed, looking over some articles, but they left without purchasing, saying they would return the following day, which they failed to do.

CHARLES COLE, English, 40 years of age, 5ft. 9in., slight build, thin dark brown hair, dark brown whiskers, beard and moustache, beard turning grey, long thin face, very bad teeth, one projecting in the upper jaw left side, sallow complexion, a farmer, usually dressed in light tweed trowsers, dark coat and billycock hat, is charged on a warrant filed in Commissioner's Office, with deserting his wife Mary Ann Cole, at Harewood Road on 16th April last.

ANDREW BARRY, Irish, 5ft. 8 in., medium build, fair whiskers, shaved on chin and upper lip, smart active appearance, formerly waiter at J. W. Oram's City Hotel, Christchurch, and afterwards Steward on board the s.s. "Taranaki," is charged on warrant filed in Commissioner's Office, with neglecting to provide for his illegitimate female child, of which Esther Ellis is the mother.

CORNELIUS DONOVAN, 34 years of age, 5ft. 8in., dark complexion, dark hair, whiskers, and moustache, dark brown eyes, slightly bald on top of head, cut on lower lip, stout build, Irish expression of countenance, is charged on warrant filed in Commissioner's Office, with neglecting to comply with an order of the Kaiapoi Bench, to pay the sum of 15s. weekly for the maintenance of his wife and family.

Missing Friends.

ENQUIRY should be made for the present whereabouts of Daniel McFadyen, Scotch storeman, about 30 years of age, about 5ft. 10in., black hair, whiskers, if any, small; was last seen at Christchurch Cattle Show about two years ago, about which time he was supposed to have had some employment in or about Timaru. This inquiry is made for the purpose of putting him in possession of some letters from home. Information to be sent to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.

ANXIOUS inquiry is made for the whereabouts, if living, of Graham Hunter Pierce, a Londoner, supposed to be known as William Pierce, a cricketer, and to have been bowler to the U.C.C.C.; he would be now about 28 years of age, 5ft. 10in., curly brown hair, good and bright looking generally. He was left-handed and had been in the 12th Lancers, but was bought out, and sailed from London in September 1866, for New Zealand; was on Mr. W. Robinson's station for some time, and was last heard of at Addington in 1871-72. Information to be sent to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch.

WANTED the present whereabouts of Theodore Arthur Walsh Griffiths, English, 32 years of age, 5ft. 10 or 11in., slight build, sallow complexion, dark eyes, black hair, very small dark beard, no whiskers or moustache, medium forehead, very small black eyebrows, medium nose, chin, and mouth, slovenly gait, a labourer; when last seen was dressed in dark suit, light coloured wideawake hat and lace up boots. Yankee appearance. Has a wife and four children at Courtenay. He was seen in Wellington last month.
