Stolen.

STOLEN on the 5th December, 1875, from the dwelling of Charles Haggie, South Town Belt, Christchurch, two shirt studs, fronts composed of American gold dollar, and backs of silver penny or three half-penny pieces, also a silver clouded glass sleeve link, value, £1, and identifiable. Robert McLaren, aged 20, 5ft., brown hair, fresh complexion, stout build, broad shoulders, no beard or whiskers, one front tooth out, given to bad language, smart tidy appearance, dressed when last seen in Christchurch, in light grey sac coat, dark grey tweed trousers, very light grey soft felt hat, generally wears a gold scarf pin of Jockey cap pattern, is suspected.

STOLEN from the British Hotel, Lyttelton, between 10 a.m., 10th and 2 p.m., 12th ultimo, a silver hunting lever watch, new, makers name Peterson, Christchurch, No. 96652, the property of John Pearce. Identifiable.

STOLEN from George E. Freestone's, Northcote road, Papanui, on the 13th ultimo, an iron pinion wheel, with 4in. bore, slotted for the shaft in centre, and 4in., cogs, supposed to be about half hundred weight. Identifiable.

LOST in Christchurch on the 19th ultimo, by James W. Catton, manager for the Hon. E. W. Stafford at Lansdowne, a silver-balance lever watch, No. 35091; Bartle, of Brigg, Lincolnshire, England, maker, value, £10. Identifiable.

STOLEN on the 23rd ultimo, a medium size dog registration collar, for current year, No. 5621, the property of John Johnston, Papanui road. Identifiable.

STOLEN between 2 p.m., 22nd and 9 a.m., 24th ultimo, from the house occupied by Mr. Jamieson and his men at Halswell, one new double white blanket, red edging; two single grey blankets, yellow stripes in centre, edged with blue, white, yellow, and red; one old single white blanket; one pair old grey tweed trousers, with hole behind; one long single-breasted overcoat, two side pockets, one out-side breast pocket, white splash of paint on side, made of same material as ladies' water-proofs. Identifiable. The horse was broken into.

SUPPOSED to have been stolen sometime since 1st July, 1875, between Manuherikia and Black's, Otago Province, a grey horse, aged, about 15 hands high, branded B (conjoined) on off-shoulder, dark mane and tail, shod all round, value, £17, the property of W. L. Foster, of Clyde. Walter Bayfeild, English, about 26 years, 5ft. 10in., dark hair, whiskers, and moustache, sharp features, prominent nose, smart appearance, recently employed as groom at the Dunstan Hotel, dressed in grey trousers and vest, black billy-cock hat, and brown knitted jacket, is suspected, having been seen by a man named Webb, going into Black's on the 4th January, 1876, with a grey horse answering the description, and is supposed to have gone towards Timaru, via St. Bathans, and through the Timaru Pass.

WILLIAM CLARKE, English, carpenter, about 40 years, 5ft. 7 or 8in., slender build, light brown hair, beard, and whiskers, shaved on upper lip, long thin face, is charged on warrant, filed in Commissioner's office, with obtaining money by means of a valueless cheque, from Messrs. Rae and Goodwin, Rangitata, on the 7th ultimo. Offender is believed to be identical with William Clarke Earl who is wanted upon similar charges in Otago.

H. HULT, 22 years, 5ft 8in., slight build, light fair hair, beard, and whiskers, dark tweed suit, nearly new, Yankee hat, respectable appearance, is charged on warrant, filed in Commissioner's office, with larceny of valuable securities, the property of Mr. John R. Pearson, of Oxford, on the 15th ultimo, consisting of two cheques, one for £1 6s. 6d., which is now in possession of the Police, and the other for £3. 12s. 3d., drawn by John Mullin, in favour of R. McQuillan.

WILLIAM CLARK EARL, *alias* William Clark, Scotch, carpenter, about 40 years, 5ft. 11in., grey hair, bald, round lump on top of forehead, slight build, thin features, dark sallow complexion, supposed to have lost one of upper front teeth, dressed in dark tweed clothes, white felt hat with wideawake leaf, red and white comforter, is charged on warrant from Dunedin, with obtaining money by false pretences from William Jamieson, of Dunedin.

EDWARD KENNEDY, Irish, 30 years, 5ft. 9in., stout and well built, round face, brown hair, whiskers, and moustache, about three weeks growth of beard on chin, a labourer, dressed in brown coat with large outside hip pockets, split tails, tweed vest, dirty moleskin trousers, small black soft felt hat with white puggree, blue stripes at end, old canvas shoes, much worn and burst at sides, is charged on warrant, filed in the Commissioner's office, with stealing a watch, since recovered, from the person of John Keig, at Rangiora, between 7 and 8 p.m., 22nd ultimo.

JOHN MITCHELL WILLIAMS, late second mate of ship "Waikato," is charged on warrant, filed in Commissioner's office, with larceny of a sailor's chest and bag, bundle of bedding, pair of boots, and navigation book, belonging to Captain Henry Dunsford, of Lyttelton, on the 14th ultimo, also with obtaining money by false pretences of him. Offender sailed for Wellington per "Ladybird" steamer, the same day. Description—English, about 22 years, 5ft. 9 or 10in., medium build, dark complexion, dark hair, small dark whiskers and moustache, generally dressed in blue coat and billycock hat, large feet, stoops when walking, inclined to be flash, and fond of talking about women.

CHARLES HOPKINS, English, painter, 37 years, 5ft. 6in., dark complexion and hair, brown beard, whiskers, and moustache, thin build, smart appearance, dressed in working clothes, daubed with paint, is charged on

warrant, filed in Commissioner's office, with deserting his wife, Harriet Agnes Hopkins, at Christchurch, on the 24th December, 1875.

JOHN HUNT, Scotch, bootmaker, 27 years, 5ft. 4 or 5in., dark complexion, black hair, small black moustache, no hair on face, medium build, dark eyes, light grey jacket and vest, black and grey tweed trousers, plain shoes, black felt hat, is charged on warrant, with deserting his wife and family at Dunedin, on the 15th ultimo. He is believed to have gone to Oamaru or Christchurch.

Missing Friends.

ENQUIRY is made for the present whereabouts of Mary Anne Cleary, who arrived in this Province in the ship "Appelles" on the 5th May, 1874, and was for some time servant at the Rev. W. Aylmer's, Akaroa, which place she left on the 11th October, 1875, for Christchurch. Description: 24 or 25 years of age, 5ft. high, medium build, dark complexion and hair. Domestic servant. She is believed to be in service somewhere up-country.

ENQUIRY is made for the present whereabouts of James Jones, a native of Auckland, 17 years of age, tall and slim, black hair, fair fresh complexion. On the 15th of January 1875 Jones was paid off from Mr. McLean's station, Waitaki, from whence he went to Oamaru, and was employed looking after a horse. In December 1875 he is believed to have been employed at Whalesback station, McKenzie Country, when he said he intended going to Otago.
