Stolen.

LOST or stolen from Lyttelton, between the 28th February and the 9th March, 1876, a brown wooden box, about 14in x 9in., containing jewellery, addressed "Mrs. Meadows, Kaikoras," and identifiable.

STOLEN from the residence of Mr. G. A. Reade, corner of Park Terrace and Carlton Road, between twelve midnight, 19th, and 7 a.m. 20th March, 1876, an old blue monkey jacket, and an old pair of tweed trousers. Identifiable. The house was burglarously entered, and Mr Reade offers a reward of £20 for the discovery of the offender.

STOLEN from a cupboard, in the vestry of Avonside Church, between 8 p.m. 23rd, and 8 a.m. 24th ultimo, a small dark polished cedar wood box, containing £7 in single notes, eleven shillings, and £5 chiefly composed of sixpenny and threepenny

pieces, the property of the Churchwardens of Avonside parish. Box only identifiable.

STOLEN from the waggon of A. Wilson and Sons, storekeepers at Temuka, whilst standing outside the Cave Hotel, McKenzie Country, during the evening of the 16th ultimo, four pair light brown cord trousers, size 4 and 5, value £6; one pair white moleskin trousers, size 6, value 16s. 6d.; one pair black cloth trousers, size 5, value 27s. 6d.; four or five pairs dark brown vests, men's size, corded points and sleeves, value £4 10s.; one black cloth vest, men's, size 5, value 18s 6d.; one double-breasted vest with white silk spots, value 21s.; four or five pairs strapped tweed trousers, value £6; one red blanket with two black stripes down centre, value 30s.; two pairs brown plaid trousers, value £2.; one dark grey vest, size 5, value 17s. 6d.; two pairs diamond tweed trousers, value £2.; several other articles tied up in a bundle, value 30s. Identifiable. A doubtful case, the driver of the waggon, Thomas White, being the worse for liquor the same evening.

JOHN BANFILL, French, 35 years, 5ft. 4in., rather stout build, dark complexion, dark whiskers, beard and moustache, grey eyes, has been a sailor, and has bust of a female tattooed on his right arm, dressed in dark blue coat, dirty tweed trousers, and light brown slouched felt hat, is charged on warrant, filed in Commissioner's office, with deserting his wife, Catherine Banfill, at Christchurch, on the 19th ultimo. This offender came originally from the West Coast, and is known to the Police there. *Vide Canterbury Police Gazette, 1875, page 51 and 113.*

ON the 19th ultimo, some person or persons maliciously tore down half-a-chain of paling fence, the private property of Mr. Alfred Simpson, Oxford Terrace, near Madras street bridge, Christchurch.

AT 8 p.m. on the 14 ultimo, a stack of straw and 700 bushels of wheat in bags, the property of Messrs. Quion, Bros., Makikihi, was set on fire. Suspicion attaches to William Voyce, blacksmith, English, about 27 years of age, 5ft. 10in., stout build, fair complexion, and William Ashbolt, blacksmith, American, about 30 years of age, 5ft. 7in., medium build, sandy complexion, beard and moustache, cheeks clean shaved. Both parties are still at Makikihi. The property was uninsured.

ON the 24th ultimo, a white swan the property of Sir Cracroft Wilson, and which has been bred upon the river at Cashmere, was found dead, with its wings tied to a flax bush. It is supposed to have been done by some boys bathing in the river.
