Stolen.

STOLEN, on the 2nd ultimo, from the stable of Samuel Needham, Christchurch, a small light harness patent leather collar, opens at the top, newly lined; identifiable.

DURING the night of the 8th ult. a horse, the property of John Clarke, was stolen from a piece of grass land in Lichfield street, where the animal was tethered, the rope having been cut. Horse described as a bright bay gelding, aged, 15 hands high, star on forehead, indistinct brand on near shoulder, shod all round; identifiable.

BETWEEN 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. on the 20th ult., the dwelling of Jane Malcolm, of South town belt, was broken into, and the following property stolen therefrom :—Two feather pillows, one pair white double blankets, soiled spot in centre; one pair of sheets, one of them with a seam in centre, and a hole near seam; one counterpane, soiled at one end; six small silver spoons, six nearly new knives and forks, with black handles; a white flannel petticoat, with "Jane Malcolm" worked in red cotton on band; a black watered marine petticoat, two cutglass tumblers, two books, viz.:—" The Fiery Cross," and "Hunted to Death." All identifiable.

STOLEN, from Turton's Hotel, Ashburton, on the night of the 17th ult., anewlight-coloured leather pocketbook, the property of W. H. Simpson (since recovered), containing a £1 note, half-a-crown, and a promissory note for £19, drawn by H. Money, in favour of W. H. Simpson, endorsed by James Wilson, payable on 11th April inst., at Mr. Money's, Mount Ida, Otago. Promissory note identifiable. From circumstances that have transpired since the alleged theft it is thought probable that Simpson did not lose the property.

STOLEN, on the 25th ult., from the Irwell Hotel, Selwyn, a cheque, the property of David Wilson, of Leeston, for the sum of £7 10s. The cheque (since recovered) was presented to the landlady of the "George and Dragon," Templeton, by two men, known as James Cunnack, and Bill Ward. The first of these has been arrested. Ward, *alias* "Bill the Bricks," is described as 33 years of age, 5ft. 7in. high, swarthy complexion; beard, whiskers, and moustache inclined to be sandy; wore dark brown hat, blue serge shirt, moleskin trousers, and laceup boots; carried a blue blanket swag. Supposed to have gone towards the Rakaia, by Selwyn. He is known in the Ashburton and neighbourhood, Leeston, Selwyn, Northern and Hurunui districts, where he has been employed at labouring work.

STOLEN from the dwelling of Mrs. W. M'Pherson, Port Lyttelton, a silver dessert fork and spoon; date of loss not known. Fanny Worgan, a servant at the house, is suspected of the theft. Property identifiable.

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STOLEN, during the night of the 1st inst., from a paddock in Chester street east, a red and white spotted short-horned heifer, 20 months old, very fat and square built, branded S on off rump; identifiable. The animal is the property of Mr. E. C. J. Stevens, who offers a reward of £10 for her recovery, and the conviction of the offender.

Inquests.

AN Inquest was held at Sumner on the 7th ult., before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of John Walker, aged 59 years. Verdict—Died from natural causes.

An Inquest was held at Waihi Flat on the 4th ult., before B. Woolcombe, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Margaret Jane Campbell, aged 20 months, who met with her death by being accidentally drowned in a trough of water. Verdict accordingly.

AN Inquest was held at Southbridge on the 6th ult., before W. B. C. Christy, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Edmund J. O. Bridge, aged 3 years and 3 months, who was found drowned in a creek near his parent's residence. Verdict—Found drowned.

AN Inquest was held at Lyttelton on the 8th ult., before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Walter J. Newman, aged 12 years, who was found drowned in a creek in Port Levy. Verdict—Found Drowned.

An Inquest was held at the Wharf Hotel, Ferry road, on the 9th ult., on the body of Isabella H. Berg, aged 28 years, who was found floating in the River Heathcote on the day previous. Verdict—Found dead in the River Heathcote, but how or by what means she came to her death there is no evidence to show.

AN Inquest was held on the 18th ult., at the Christchurch Hospital, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Thomas Purcell, aged 84 years, who was found floating in the River Avon on the day previous. Verdict—Found drowned.

An Inquest was held on the 24th ult., at Christchurch, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Joseph Denny, a farmer, aged 45 years, who met with his death from injuries received by falling against the fly-wheel of a thrashing machine. Verdict—Accidental death.

An Inquest was held at Temuka on the 27th ult., before B. Woolcombe, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Joseph Jennings, a labourer, aged 37 years, who died suddenly on the 25th ult., from disease of the heart. Verdict—Died from natural causes.

An Inquest was held on the 30th ult., at Christchurch, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Lucy Smith, aged 39 years, who died from the effects of congestion of the brain a few hours after her confinement. Verdict—Died from natural causes. AN Inquest was held on the 31st ult., at Christchurch, before J. W. S. Coward, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Henry William Smith, an illegitimate child, aged 8 weeks, who died on the 29th ult. from congestion of the brain. Verdict—Died from congestion of the brain.

Missing Friend.

ENQUIRIES are requested respecting Patrick Sullivan, who left his wife Mary Sullivan, at Sandhurst, Victoria, about three years ago for New Zealand. When last heard of in December, 1858, was supposed to be living with a man named Andrew Dann, near Christchurch. No description of Sullivan is given. A WARRANT has been issued at Oamaru for the arrest of Robert Marshall Simpson, charged with deserting his wife Marian Simpson, at Oamaru, on the 21st ult. He is a cook, 45 years of age, 5ft. 9in. high, stout build, fair complexion, sandy beard, whiskers and moustache, light blue eyes, dressed in cord trousers, grey tweed sack coat, and hat and watertight boots.

A WARRANT has been issued for the arrest of William Gillon, charging him with a violent assault on John Mesham. He is described as a Scotchman, 30 years of age, about 6ft. high, stout build, brown hair, goatee beard, cast in left eye, generally dressed in black felt hat, moleskin trousers, and watertight boots; wears his hat down over his left eye; generally goes about the country doing havest or other farm work. Warrant filed in Commissioner's office.

BETWEEN the hours of 6 p.m. and 10 p.m. on the 22nd ult., some person or persons unknown maliciously set fire to a heap of straw covering forty bags of oats, the property of William Shaw, of Leeston road; the oats were saved, but the bags completely destroyed.
