Stolen.

STOLEN, from G L. Beath & Co., between the 20th and 30th October, 1872, 5 pairs grey Geelong tweed trousers, and 4 double-breasted vests to match, dark stripes up the trousers; 5 black venetian cloth sac coats, men's sizes. These articles were stolen from two cases of drapery in transit from Melbourne to Christchurch.

STOLEN, from behind the bar of the Zetland Arms Hotel, Cashel Street, a brown wooden box, about 4 x 4, containing three single notes, bank or number not known; one English sovereign, two half-sovereigns, and about two pounds in silver, mostly shillings, and some threepenny pieces—box identifiable. Francis Forden is suspected of this: age 40, 5ft. 2in., stout build, dark hair and whiskers, dirty appearance, dressed in dirty tweed suit and billycock hat.

STOLEN, from the person of Mr. Edward Wakefield, between 11 p.m. 8th and 2 a.m. 9th November, 1872, a black morocco pocket-book, lined with scarlet leather, containing letters addressed to Mr. Wakefield, a passage ticket by the s.s. *Phabe*, one £5 note, and one or two £1 notes—pocket-book and papers identifiable.

STOLEN, from the person of Robert Dickie, at Robertson's Hotel, Waikari, during the

night of the 18th inst., two £1 notes—not identifiable. Peter Andrews and Andrew McGregor suspected, the former an Englishman, 40 years, 5ft. 6in. or 7in., slight build, dark whiskers, mixed with grey, chin shaved, dressed in moleskin trousers and dark tweed coat; the latter a Scotchman, about 50 years, 5ft. 7in. or 8 in., stout build, white hair and beard, dressed in moleskin trousers and dark tweed coat—supposed to have gone towards Christchurch.

STOLEN, from a little girl named Collinson, about 5 p.m. on the 14th November, 1872, a cheque on the Bank of New Zealand, for £1 10s., signed W. Morton, payable to bearer. The cheque was passed to Messrs. Dartnall & Co., High Street, by a woman about 35 years of age, thin build, respectable appearance, and has since been paid into the bank.

STOLEN, from Rangiora, on the 26th November, 1872, between the hours of 2 p.m. and 5 p.m., a bay mare, saddle and bridle, the property of Mr. Henry Perrott, of Ashley Bank, mare branded something like **W** on near shoulder, fore and hind feet on near side white, two or three white streaks on belly from girth galls; 1 snaffle-bridle with stitched noseband and single rein, nearly new; saddle, with hogskin seat, and plain small stirrup irons, hide girth of four plaited strands—all identifiable.

THOMAS WILLIAMS, *alias* White, is charged on warrant, filed in Commissioner's office, with forgery and uttering. Description:—English, 46 years, 5ft. 2in. or 3in., medium build, fair complexion, blue eyes, thin hollow cheeks, small moustache and beard, inclined to grey; bald on top of head, sharp nose, one or two front teeth loose or out, very quick speaking and excitable, a gardener, fond of talking about flowers. Dress when last seen:—Tweed suit, drab tyrolese hat, sometimes wears black coat and hat, very dresy and natty.

— **GERARD**, *alias* German Jerry, is charged on warrant with stealing from the dwelling of Frederick Brandt, old landing, Inangahua, near Reefton, on the 1st November, 1872, one £20 note, Bank New South Wales; two £10 notes, Union Bank of Australia, one of which is identifiable; four £5 notes, three of which were Bank of New Zealand; twenty-eight £1 notes, 23 ozs. 17 dwts. of scaly gold, one Crimean shirt (identifiable), with red and yellow stripes, one pair flannel drawers, one neck scarf. Description:—German, sailor, about 24 years, 5ft. 10in., stout build; dark complexion, small black moustache, no whiskers, high cheek bones, projecting lips.

The following persons are charged on warrant filed in the Office of Inspector of Armed Constabulary, Auckland, with conspiracy to defraud various of her Majesty's subjects who purchased shares in the Green Harp Gold Mining Company, during the months of May, June, and July, 1872.

HOWE, **THOMAS**.—5ft. 6in., about 37 years of age, slight build, black curly hair, slight whiskers, beard, and moustache, thin features, Roman nose, smart appearance; an Irishman, fond of horse racing.

O'RIEILY, **EUGENE**.—6ft., 38 years, medium build, brown hair inclined to curl, small moustache and goatee, cheeks shaved, Yankee appearance, high cheek bones, square built, and walks erect, sallow complexion; an Irish American.

WALSH, **WILLIAM**.—5ft. 11 in., 30 years, medium build, fair hair, long sandy beard and moustache, fresh complexion; an Irishman, has a peculiarity of always keeping his mouth open.

CUMMINS, **JAMES**.—5ft. 6in., 31 years, stout build, brown hair, light moustache and goatee, cheeks shaved, high cheek bones, coarse Yankee appearance; speaks with a strong Irish accent.

SHEEHAN, **THOMAS**.—5ft. 6in., 30 years, thick-set build, dark brown hair, beard and moustache, short round features, sallow complexion, dirty, sulky appearance; speaks with a strong Irish accent.

A CASE of supposed incendiarism on the premises in the occupation of Mr. John Fisher, Papanui Road, at 9.15 p.m. on the 22nd November, 1872, has been reported. Mrs. Fisher's daughter, going out of doors at the hour mentioned observed a fire starting against the door of a stable used as a workshop, in close proximity to the dwelling-house; she at once gave the alarm, and her mother and a visitor, named William Hill, put out the fire. A piece of candle and some rags and straw had been placed against the stable door; the rags corresponded with an old shirt and trowsers found in the garden of a neighbour named Hamilton, who was not on good terms with Fisher.

AN inquest was held on the body of George Blackhall, late cook at the Pareora Station, Timaru District, before B Woollcombe, Esq., Coroner, on the 27th November, 1872. The body was found in a creek near Mount Horrible, on 21st November, by a party in search of missing friend, Murdoch McLean, who was found drowned in the Washdyke Creek, with a piece of pig-iron weighing 72 lbs. tied to his neck with a piece of green flax; in which case the jury returned an open verdict. In Blackhall's case the jury returned a verdict of wilful murder against some person or persons unknown. The deceased was last seen alive on the 24th October, 1872, when he was at Pavey's house, Washdyke, and had on his person an open faced silver lever watch, with a new pattern flat glass, and steel Albert chain; also a pocket-book containing views of Melbourne, &c., neither of which articles were on the body when found.

Missing Friends.

INQUIRY has been made as to the whereabouts of James William Banks, age 50, height 5ft. 7½ or 8in. ; black hair and beard worn full, with here-and-there a few straggling light coloured hairs, sharp, dark eyes, dark complexion, very much pock-marked, large white teeth, the first double tooth on each side of top jaw gone ; dresses smartly, round active figure, is a straw hat maker by trade, but would be likely to adapt himself to other callings ; has been at the Molyneux River and at Christchurch ; frequents places of amusement, and was a regular attendant at places of worship, particularly Wesleyan ; came to New Zealand from Emerald Hill, Victoria, about 1859 or 1860.

INQUIRIES have been made as to the whereabouts of Alexander McCrae and his wife Mary, maiden name McDonald, both natives of Inverness, Scotland. Descriptions :—a mason, about 35 years, 5ft. 10in., stout build, about 12 stone weight, brown hair, dark whiskers and complexion, a front tooth out of the upper jaw, leans a good deal to the left side when walking. His wife Mary is about 35 years, short, stout build, below the average height, black hair, and fresh complexion ; they were married at Warrnambool, Victoria, in 1861 ; the man came to Otago in 1862, was digging for some time, and was at the building of the Kawarau bridge near the Molyneux Junction, where he was joined by his wife in 1865. He left there shortly after for the West Coast rush, and both were reported drowned crossing

the Hokitika Bar. Two years afterwards an acquaintance contradicted this report, and said McCrae was on some claim up the Grey river, and that his wife and two children were living in Christchurch.

ANXIOUS enquiry is being made as to the whereabouts of Captain Joseph Thomas, aged about 65 years, height 6ft. 3in., fine looking appearance, supposed to have settled in Otago in 1848, as a farmer or stationholder. Heirship to a property is involved in this inquiry.

INQUIRY has been made for the whereabouts of William Davenport, shepherd, Scotch, between 35 and 40 years, 6ft. 1in., thin build, thin face, light hair, pale complexion, blue eyes, a little hair on chin, cheeks shaved, rather round shouldered, quiet manner, about 12 stone weight, dressed in sac coat of tweed, rather dark coloured ; vest of same material, old Windsor cord trousers, elastic-side boots, black billycock hat, carried a gun, with which he said he intended to shoot pigs on the Peninsula. He also ordered Albert Haywood, of Lyttelton, to build a boat for him, but he has never returned for it. As he had money upon him, fears are entertained for his safety. Any intelligence of him to be sent to the Commissioner of Police, Christchurch. Davenport was last seen about the latter end of September or beginning of October, and had been quarrying stone at the Amuri before that.
