

Message from THE HON. SIR LÉON GÖTZ, K.C.V.O.

Amidst the variety of organisations concerned with wildlife administration, the Wildlife Branch of the Department of Internal Affairs, although small and highly specialised, plays an important role in the struggle to preserve native fauna and stocks of game birds and fish.

Most New Zealanders now live in urban areas, and as living conditions become more restricted, the greater is the desire for recreation in natural surroundings. While large and distant reserves are important, so, too, is the preservation of wildlife nearer at hand, whether it be on a lagoon, along the shore line, or in that small clump of remnant forest.
