

ABOVE: On the reserve at Castle Hill in Canterbury grow the only plants in the world of the native buttercup Ranunculus paucifolius. In 1948 there were only 32 plants left. An ecological survey was made and as a result of applying the conclusions from it there are now 200 plants, and the species has been saved from possible extinction.
