St. Andrew's Church and Mr. William Culpán.

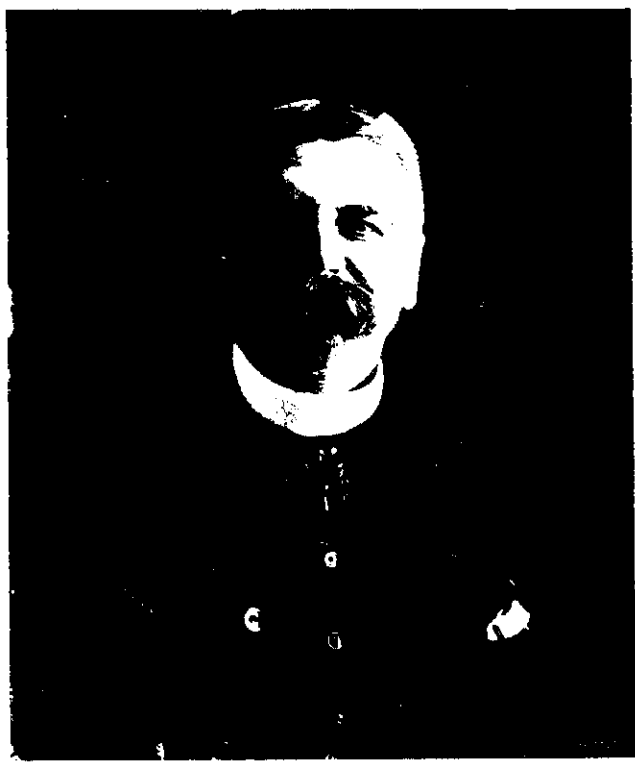
